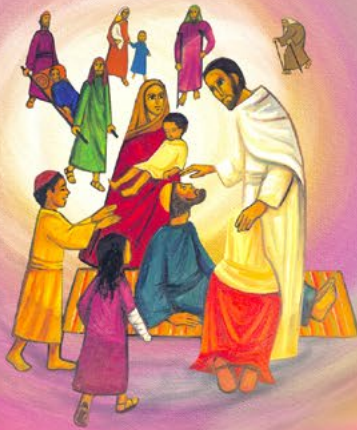
Enjoy a very special time with your children this evening, hearing your child's thoughts about this Sunday's Gospel and this Wednesday's word, which is **HEALING**.

THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 4th February 2024



On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway.

He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them. That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many evil spirits, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was. In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there.

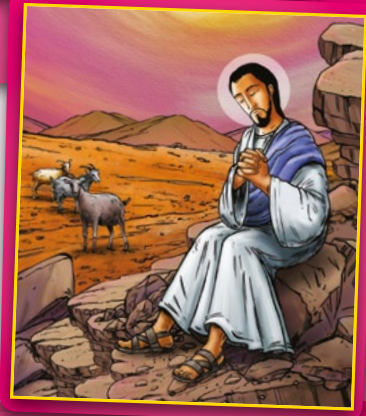

3 Loving & Growing

This Sunday's Gospel reminds us how, in Jesus, God is active in the world, bringing healing. At differing times and in differing ways, we all need the healing touch of God. Ask your child what the word 'healing' means to them. It may help your child if you tell them about the different kinds of healing we can experience in life. Then ask your child who brings healing to them, bringing comfort when they are ill, hurt or upset.

As a family, consider if there is anyone to whom you can help bring God's healing in this coming week. What could you do? Perhaps you could: pray for someone and ask them to pray for you too; talk gently and lovingly to someone if there is a problem; take time to listen carefully to them, and try to support them where possible.
