Gospel: Mark 1:29-39



Even Jesus needs a quiet place to pray. Then he starts a new phase of his mission

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

That evening, at sundown, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed with demons. And the whole city was gathered around the door. And he cured many who were sick with various diseases, and cast out many demons; and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. And Simon and his companions hunted for him. When they found him, they said to him, "Everyone is searching for you." He answered, "Let us go on to the neighbouring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do." And he went throughout Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons.

Family Fitness Friday

Happy Friday everyone! I'd like to introduce a new concept to you; Family Fitness Friday. My aim is to get as many families as possible working out together at home, which in turn will improve everyone's Physical Literacy. Physical Literacy is "our relationship with movement and physical activity throughout life." Let's be positive role models for our children so that their Physical Literacy becomes habitual.



On the first Friday of each month, I am going to set you all a challenge to com-

plete a workout together at home. This will be accessible for all regardless of the space in your home, age or level of fitness. The workout I will set will be a HIIT workout, something the children will be familiar with after completing HIIT workouts in their phases for National Fitness Day back in September. There will be 5 different moves that you should complete for 30-40 seconds with a 20 -30 second break in between. The moves should be completed as part of a circuit 4-5 times. This month's moves are as follows:

- 1. Star jumps
- 2. High knees
- 3. Squats
- 4. Left right jabs
- 5. Lunges




