Break Time Snacks

Break time staff and lunchtime supervisors have been reporting that children are coming in to school with snacks at break that go against our healthy eating values. Break time snacks should be made up of fruit or vegetables. We have seen lots of sugary snacks/bars containing nuts. Please stick to fruit and/or vegetable snacks.



School Uniform

During the first week back there has been a uniform 'amnesty' as I understand that parents may have had difficulties securing the correct uniform. From Tuesday, we will be sending uniform slips home to ask for the required uniform to be worn.

These are the combinations of uniform allowed until autumn half term. Girls may wear: yellow gingham summer dress; grey pinafore with a white shirt and tie; grey skirt/trousers with a white shirt and tie; grey skirt/trousers with a St. Joseph's yellow polo shirt; St. Joseph's cardigan.

Boys may wear: grey trousers with a white shirt and tie; grey shorts with a white shirt and tie; grey shorts/trousers with a polo shirt; St. Joseph's jumper.

Girls may wear grey tights; grey, white or brown socks. Boys may wear grey socks. Shoes must be black with toes and heels fully enclosed.

Hair clips/bands/ties need to be yellow, brown or black.

PE kit: Yellow T-Shirt, black shorts, plimsolls/trainers, grey tracksuit (with St. Joseph's logo or unbranded) and optional waterproof tracksuit.



Going back to school can be a difficult time. Maybe your child is worried about having a new teacher, feeling motivated or homework. It's good to remember that these feelings are common.

Helpful Tips

- Get organised use planners, diaries and apps to keep track of things
- Set goals make sure they're small and managable
- Look after them and yourself: take time to do the things you enjoy!

Top Tip!

Did you know that when you feel anxious, scared, or overwhelmed, your body starts to act like it's getting ready to fight or run away even if there's no real danger?

But here's something amazing: breathing slowly and deeply is like a secret superpower! Next time your child is feeling anxious, try to help them breathe in through their nose, and out through their mouth whilst tracing your hand.


