Gospel: Luke 24:46-53



Jesus promises his followers the Holy Spirit and sends them out to witness

Jesus said to his disciples, "So it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

First Holy Communion

We have entered First Holy Communion season. In our Parish, many children celebrated their First Holy Communion last weekend; congratulations to you all. Over the next few weeks, neighbouring parishes will also be celebrating this special sacrament. Please pray for all the children. Later in June (10am on 11th June) we will celebrate our Presentation Mass where all the children who made their First Holy Communion will again celebrate together.



Social Media

Most social media platforms are age restricted to 13+ years; with good reason. Apart from the legal reasons to do with data collection of under 13s, I also feel that many children are not mature enough yet to read situations that arise in chats. In the last couple of weeks, I have had to deal with children using social media to be unkind about other children over platforms such as Snapchat and WhatsApp. This amounts to online bullying and will not be tolerated at St. Joseph's. It normally begins very innocently but then someone posts something which is mis-interpreted and it spirals into something quite horrible with words used by children which are wholly inappropriate. This usually happens outside of school during evenings and weekends.

If you do allow your child to access social media, I ask you to be vigilant. Please monitor your child's phone for inappropriate messages and even better if you switched on parental controls – phones and gaming consoles. If you see any inappropriate messages, please challenge your child on acceptable levels of usage. We have done so much work in school on online bullying that it saddens me that these situations continue to crop up. Please work with us.

The Upper Phase sponsored run, the Middle Phase Lenten Quiz and the Lower Phase Pyjama Day has shown our fundraising for good causes reach new heights. Catholic Social Teaching
