Laudato Si' project - Caring for our common home

With less than two weeks to go until Christmas, many of you will have been busy buying your loved ones presents. Please take a moment to consider how you will wrap these gifts. Across the UK is has been estimated that we will bin what equates to 108 million rolls of wrapping paper, with the average UK household using 4 rolls of wrapping paper each.



Before you wrap consider this:

- Do you have any gift bags/ boxes that you can reuse from previous years?
- Can you avoid paper loaded with glitter? Not only will this save the problem of hoovering later, it also prevents this form of microplastic making its way into our seas and affecting marine life. In fact many UK councils are now rejecting recycling bins containing glitter altogether, deeming the entire load to be 'contaminated'.
- If you are adding ribbons, can you forego the sellotape? This will reduce the use of plastic and will mean that it may be easier for the receiver to reuse their paper.

Challenge: Get inventive with your wrapping. Can you use plain brown paper and add painted pine cones, holly, stamps, or draw pictures to personalise it? Be aware of not using too much paper for one item. Dig out gift bags you have kept and reuse them.

Why not take a photo and send it in with your child to their class teacher to encourage others to play their part too?
