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
'Lest We Forget'

Nursery

In Nursery we focused on Fibonacci as our mathematician. We looked at spirals found in nature. We enjoyed reading a story and talking about the different spirals we can find in our surroundings. On Monday, we went on an autumn walk around St. Joseph's. We spotted lots of different signs that show us autumn has arrived. We enjoyed sorting leaves by shape and size as our maths activity. We discussed the meanings of the words- taller, shorter, bigger, biggest. We also learnt about ordering. We have been using conkers to count and learnt a song called 5 shiny conkers to help us count in sequence. We also used different autumn materials to make pictures. We made patterns and shapes. We talked about our pictures using positional language.



Reception

In Reception we have been looking at patterns in the environment as inspired by the mathematician Fibonacci. The children then created their own patterns using different mediums and resources .





Year 1

In Year One we learnt about the mathematician Ada Lovelace. She wrote the world's first machine algorithm for an early computing machine. We have been giving each other instructions to make animals out of cubes and to create a symmetrical pattern. We competed to make as many triangles as we could on geo-boards. We then went on an amazing problem solving scavenger hunt. We finished by making a whole class artistic geometric collage. We have really enjoyed the fun activities during Maths week and giving each other algorithms.



Year 2

Year 2 have been showing off their brilliant Maths skills this week and have proven themselves to be super Mathematicians! They know Maths is all around them! Our week included lots of fun problem solving activities and the children enjoyed using their Maths skills to solve problems both in the classroom and outdoors. We played Active Maths 'Golfing', took part in a number 'hunt', completed a Maths trail and even made an 'Archimedes screw' to finish off the week on Pen down Friday!





Year 3

This week Year 3 have used their English text *George's Marvellous Medicine* as a stimulus for some fun Maths work. We have used our understanding of capacity to follow a recipe and make our very own marvellous medicines. Using rulers and metre sticks we have made smaller versions of Grandma by halving measurements. As well as that, we have done Maths golf in PE, made multilink animals and completed a maths quiz based on our school environment.



Year 4

For Maths week, year 4 have been doing some problem solving activities and games. We started with some premier league football card Maths challenges. Children were required to use the 4 operations to solve problems involving premier league players. We then moved on to our lessons around our Mathematician, Rene Descartes. We read a story about how he created the cartesian coordinates system. The children then completed some coordinates Artwork and even played the classic board game battleships. We finished off the week by playing some Maths golf which combined physical skills with some Mathematical Knowledge.



Year 5


Year 5 have had lots of fun during this Maths Week! In our maths lessons we have focused on Escher and tessellations. In class we used card board to make a tile to create our own tessellation. We drew around the card on an A3 piece of paper and then used two or three colours to colour it in. In PE we played a game of bingo. We had to run and collect the answers to mathematics questions and take them back to our team and bingo card with the question on. Some of the cards had exercises on for us to do!





Year 6

This week in Year 6 we have been doing lots of exciting activities involving maths. We have celebrated Maths Week by creating Maths Hats which we will show off in a parade on Friday 12th November. Activities from this week had lots of cross curricular links e.g. a maths number hunt involving Morse Code, a golf style maths activity, a Premier League players maths activity, as well as other problem solving games. It was a great opportunity to work with children from different maths groups and classes and do lots of fun, outdoor activities.


Cadenza

From January, we are opening two wonderful pre-Grade 1 ensembles: '*Super Strings*' (for violin, viola, 'cello and double bass players) and '*Wind Whizzers*' (for flute, clarinet, saxophone, oboe, bassoon, trumpet, trombone, french horn and drum kit players).

The ensembles will meet once a month on Saturdays at Grange Primary School and will also include membership to Ealing Young Voices Choir!
