Gospel: Luke 9:28-36



Peter, James and John glimpsed the hidden glory of Jesus

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem.

Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" " not knowing what he said. Children visit Ealing Council

Yesterday, three of our Year 5 pupils had the fantastic opportunity to visit Perceval House in Ealing. This visit was part of a wider deanery initiative, where pupils from Catholic schools across Ealing came together to engage with local government and explore how Ealing Council supports initiatives connected to Catholic Social Teaching themes.

During their time at Perceval House, the children met with the Mayor, local councillors and officials, asking insightful questions about how the council upholds values such as human dignity, the common good, and the preferential option for the poor. They also gained a deeper understanding of how the council operates, learning about the decision-making process and the role of local government in supporting the community.

Our pupils represented St Joseph's with confidence, curiosity, and respect, showing a real passion for social justice and positive change in our community. It was a wonderful opportunity for them to work alongside children from other Catholic schools in the Ealing Deanery, and we are incredibly proud of their contributions.
