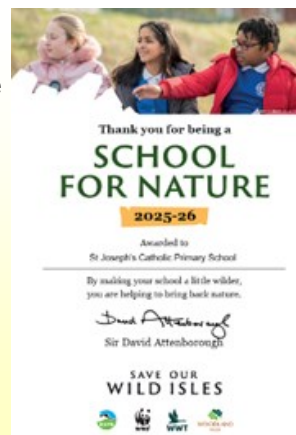
"Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute." — Proverbs 31:8

They even saw calves that were only 3 days old! The children were very eager to enjoy their lunch before the next activity. To top off a fantastic day, everyone enjoyed a fantastic play session in the massive outdoor park and raced down the giant indoor slide!
