Gospel: Luke 9:11-17



They all ate and were filled

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.'

He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.'

They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.

Idling Engines

I have received a few complaints from residents in the past few days when the weather has been hot about parents leaving their engines running, I presume to keep their Air Conditioning on. The residents are going to ask the Council for enforcement measures. It is worth remembering that:

- Air pollution in London alone is linked to around 4,000 deaths each year
- Under Section 42 of the Road Traffic Act 1988 and Regulation 98 of the Road Vehicles Regulations 1986, it's an offence to keep your engine running unnecessarily while stationary
- Drivers refusing to turn off an idling engine can face a £20–£80 Fixed Penalty Notice
- Switching off while waiting (like school pick-ups) noticeably clears the local air you and your children breathe and saves fuel.

Healthy Activity and Food Programme (HAF)

Soon we will receive a delivery of HAF postcards which will be distributed to children who are entitled to benefit related free school meals. Eligible pupils (those receiving benefits-related free school meals) will be automatically added to the booking system. 


