Gospel: Matthew 22:15-21



Jesus refused to be drawn into a sterile argument, about paying taxes to Caesar

The Pharisees went and plotted to entrap Jesus in what he said. So they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and teach the way of God in accordance with truth, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality. Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?"

But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites? Show me the coin used for the tax." And they brought him a denarius. Then he said to them, "Whose head is this, and whose title?" They answered, "The emperor's." Then he said to them, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that belong to him, and to God what belongs to God."

Consultation

In a few weeks, the local authority will begin a consultation on behalf of the Governing Body of St. Joseph's Catholic Primary School on reducing the Published Admission Number (PAN) from 90 to 60 in reception from 2025. Several schools (St. Gregory's, St. Raphael's, Stanhope, Berrymede and Hobbayne) in our area have reduced their PAN in recent times due to the falling number of children in Ealing. St. Joseph's has remained at three forms of entry to ensure that there has been enough capacity in terms of school places in Ealing. However, the prediction for pupil numbers from 2024 sees a substantial decline and as the school is currently 40 children down across the school, the shortfall in pupil numbers will have an impact on the school budget. Please look out for details on the consultation on www.ealing.gov.uk/consultation from 6th November 2023 until 22nd December 2023. More details available on the big yellow poster in the school office entrance lobby.

Year 7 Secondary School Applications

Year 6 parents please be mindful of the fact that applications need to be submitted by 31st October. Catholic Secondary Schools need to have received the Supplementary Information Forms by then too. The office has been in touch with parents of children who have applied to in borough schools but we do not have details of children who are applying to out of borough schools. Please do not leave it to the last minute, your child deserves more than that.

Black History Month

During the month of October we have been taking part in Black History Month. The children have focused their studies on particular people from black African/Caribbean backgrounds who have made an impact on our society. On Friday 3rd November we will celebrate our work as a whole school. On that day, I ask that every child come to school wearing any of the following coloured clothing representing:

Black = resilience Red = love Yellow = optimism and justice/fairness Green = greenery/nature

Children from black African/ Caribbean heritage who have any flags and/or cultural clothes are invited to come to school with them.



Times Table Rock Stars

What an amazing response we have had from our Year 2-6 pupils to the launch of our exciting online resource Times Tables Rock Stars. Pupils in Middle and Upper Phases were introduced to the resource by Mrs. Whybrew and have been allocated usernames and logins which were sent home with an information sheet three weeks ago by class teachers. We are asking children to focus on the 'Single Player' mode games (of which there are 5) until Christmas, after which we will be organizing inter-school tournaments and an exciting 'Maths Rock Star Day'.



How often should children be playing? Every day for 10 minutes.

Guide to the games

Jamming – a relaxed game (untimed) which allows children to practice specific times tables **Gig** – To be completed once a month. This game has 100 questions and will help children, parents and staff to see progress month-on-month. All children need to complete a gig if they haven't done so far.

Garage – Playing games on this will help fill in the pupils' 'heatmaps' which identify the tables that pupils don't know and the speed at which they can recall them.

Studio – Play 10 times to receive your 'Rock Star' status. We can then print out your child's certificate and get them up on the Wall of Fame.

Soundcheck – Beat the clock game helps to improve speed.

In a child's daily practice of ten minutes (or more) they should always aim to play at least 2 Garage games and 2 Studio games. This will ensure that progress is visible which will be both rewarding and motivating.
