Cardinal Wiseman Experience Days

This week, Year 5 were treated to three experience days at Cardinal Wiseman. The children went in their classes and 'experienced' being in secondary school for a morning. On Tuesday, one Year 5 class was met at the office and received a warm welcome and then it was straight off to lessons. English was very interesting; it was about Frankenstein written by Mary Shelley. Not, not only did the children read an extract but then they drew the monster itself once they had understood the description. The next lesson was Maths, where they learnt about Algebra. It was fun as they played "Algebra Bubbles". They also played Money Bingo where they were given a word problem and had to solve it.

Brake

Here is what one Year 5 child wrote about their Wednesday experience, "On Wednesday, our class visited Cardinal Wiseman Catholic School. We experienced the life of a child in secondary school. We stayed for the morning and went to two lessons. History, taught by Mr Bell and PE taught by Mr Johnson. They were both very nice teachers and loved the subjects they taught. In the History lesson we learnt about the Feudal System but mainly focused on the peasants! In PE we practiced our running, throwing and catching. I definitely would recommend going to this school!"

The Thursday group was treated to a Psychology lesson and an English lesson. Thank you to Cardinal Wiseman School for putting on these 'Taster Days' and thank you also to our staff for taking the children. Everyone had a fantastic time.

Reception Odds Farm Trip

On Wednesday, the children in Reception went to Odds Farm on their school trip. Their topic is 'Creatures' and they learned a lot about the animals that live on the farm. The children enjoyed having a tractor ride around the farm, feeding the sheep and goats and playing in the playgrounds that are on the farm. After lunch, the children had a chance to play in the soft play. Much fun was had! There were lots of sleepy Butterflies, Honeybees and Ladybirds on the coach ride back to school. Thank you to all the parents who accompanied the children and well done to all the children for their impeccable behaviour and being good ambassadors for the school in their St. Joseph's uniform! Thank you also to the staff who made the trip possible.



Year 6 Junior Citizens

This week, Year 6 travelled to Hanwell Town FC to meet representatives from the Metropolitan Police, London Ambulance Service, London Fire Brigade and Transport for London as part of the Junior Citizens programme. They learned some valuable information to help them stay safe and keep others safe too.

The Police talked to the children about their responsibilities when using Social Media, especially certain apps which can access smartphone cameras, not sending images of themselves and not sharing personal information. They leant that every secondary school has a Safer Schools Officer who is there to help pupils and staff, and can step in when schools are unable to deal with issues when a criminal offence has been committed e.g. cyberbullying.

The London Ambulance Service talked to everyone about when and how to use the 999 emergency number. The children earned about what types of illnesses and injuries would warrant an emergency call and how to help if they found someone unwell or unconscious.

The Fire Brigade showed Year 6 photos which demonstrated how quickly a fire can take hold and the correct procedure to follow if a fire has been detected. The children learnt that their smoke alarms should be checked every fortnight and were advised never to charge their mobile phones overnight and to always leave them on a non-flammable surface.

TfL brought their pop-up bus! They showed the children how to behave responsibly on the pavements as well as when aboard the bus – and that they should 'tap in' using their Zip Oyster which they need when they are 11 years old <u>https://tfl.gov.uk/fares/free-and-discounted-travel/11-15-zipoyster-photocard</u>. It gives them free bus travel and discounted tube travel (needs money top-up for tube travel) some children will need public transport to get to their new secondary schools. They also showed Year 6 how to use the Help Points on tube platforms –when they might use the 'Information' button and when to choose to use the 'Emergency' button. Thank you to all the staff who accompanied the children on this most valuable and informative trip.



Year 6 Theatre Trip

On Thursday, Year 6 were treated to a trip to the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane to watch a matinee performance of Frozen. For many children, this was their very first experience in a 'proper' theatre and all the children loved the fantastic singing, acting and special effects. Hits like 'Let It Go' and 'Do you want to build a snowman' were music to their ears and Olaf the Snowman puppet was a real hit with the operator performer doing his voice! Year 6 children would like to extend their thanks to the PTA who treated the children to this very enjoyable experience. Thank you to all the adults who accompanied the children on the trip. Thank you also to the patient parent body who had to wait for the coaches which were over an hour late back.


