Palm Sunday

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

St. Joseph's Day continued.. Lower Phase

Nursery children started their celebration by attending their first Phase Liturgy, where they learnt interesting facts about St. Joseph. In class, the children learned the 'St. Joseph was a Carpenter' song. They had the opportunity to decorate lilies using white pompoms, colour in pictures of lilies and use toy tools during role-play. Nursery children have also been drawing pictures of the tools St. Joseph used at his work as a carpenter.







The children in Reception went to a Liturgy in the morning and in the afternoon each class rotated around the Reception classes and enjoyed some St. Joseph focused activities; building with Lego, happy dancing and Mindfulness. All the children gave it thumbs up!















For the very first time, Year 1 were very excited to join the rest of the school at Mass on St. Joseph's Day. The children sang beautifully in Church. In the afternoon, the children had a carousel of activities in the three Year 1 classrooms. They built Lego, made a lily and decorated a biscuit with a hammer made out of icing to celebrate the day. The children really enjoyed the day.













The Middle Phase

The Middle Phase thoroughly enjoyed our St. Joseph's Day celebrations. In the afternoon, the children got creative and decorated wooden crosses in honour of St. Joseph, made a small, framed stained glass windows using tracing paper and decorated a biscuit using our St. Joseph's colours, brown, yellow and white. The staff and children made the day really special and lots of fun was had by all!







The Upper Phase

Year 5 attended the solemnity of the feast of Saint Joseph. When we returned to school, we wrote down class 5AL's winning prayer to St. Joseph into the RE books, and decorated the page. In the afternoon, Year 5 children got the opportunity to attend three creative activities to celebrate the feast or their school patron saint. These included designing prayer cards, making tool boxes and creating origami lilies. It was a splendid day!

Year 6, following Mass, some Y6's looked after Y1 children by setting a wonderful example and encouraging them to notice what Fr. Cristiano was doing. Y6 had a restful afternoon watching 'Goodnight Mister Tom'. This has been our class reading text since January and has helped us in both English and History. It tells the story of William Beech, a neglected evacuee from London, who is placed with an older man named Tom Oakley for the duration of the war. At first, they seem total opposites but as they spend more time together, Tom soon becomes the father figure William has never had. William thrives under Tom's care and guidance and they grow to love each other - no spoilers, but by the end, William calls Tom 'Dad'. It's a lovely parallel with the relationship we learn about St. Joseph being the 'father' for Jesus, guiding and helping him to develop through his early life.

Catholic Social Teaching

When we look at the world around us, it's clear that there is a great need for God's mercy and love. The Church encourages us not to turn away, but to look at how things could be. To ask ourselves: What kind of world do I want to be a part of? Then to consider: What can we offer, individually and as a community, to build it?



The Catholic Church encourage us to turn to Scripture, especially the Gospels. In the Scriptures we learn how God wants us to live. We see this most clearly through the words and actions of Jesus. What lessons can we find in passages like this from the Gospel of Luke?

"Some people came carrying a paralysed man on a stretcher, and they tried to put him in front of Jesus. Because of the crowd they could find no way to take him into the house. So they carried him up on the roof, made an opening in the tiles, and let him down into the middle of the group in front of Jesus. When Jesus saw how much faith they had, he said to the man, 'Your sins are forgiven, my friend... get up, pick up your bed, and go home!" – Luke 5:18-24 (abridged)

Year 6 Extended Project

Over a month ago, Year 6 were set an extended research project on World War Two. Even though it's a fascinating topic to study, we don't have time to talk about or teach every single thing the children are interested in. They were sent home before February half term with some suggestions about what they could research and different ways they could present their findings. Last Friday, the Year 6 classrooms transformed into project galleries so that each child could present their project at a 'stall' as well as visit others. Year five then came up to view the projects and hear the Y6's share their knowledge and enthusiasm for the subject they had chosen.

A few highlights were...Sophie's 'proper book' called Abby's War – the story of an evacuee; Ellie's standing display reflecting on the Holocaust; Paddy's documentary, filmed on location at Leicester Museum; Livia's knowledgeable talk which accompanied her PowerPoint presentation and a joint effort by Oliver P and Kacper who made a large model of a Spitfire and included detailed information.

On Thursday, we held our annual music evening. This was a chance for the children who learn to play musical instruments to showcase their skills. The children showed off their talents beautifully and all the parents present were thrilled with the performances. 


Sewing Club


