### Supermarket vouchers for October half term holiday to support families

I am writing to advise you that, **if your child is eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals**, then Ealing Council will be providing your household with additional financial support during the October half term holiday.

You will shortly receive a supermarket voucher to support you to meet food and other essential costs over the school holiday.

Ealing Council has been allocated funding to support families with children on low incomes who have been affected by the pandemic via the Government's new **Household Support Fund.** This extends the support previously offered through the COVID winter grant and local support funds.

A company called Blackhawk Network is administering the voucher scheme for Ealing Council at no cost to the council.

### How much are the vouchers worth?

October half term voucher - £15 voucher per eligible pupil

Please note that children in Reception to Year 2 who receive a free school meal under the universal infant free school meals scheme (but would not otherwise be eligible) are not entitled to receive the vouchers. To be eligible, you must be entitled to a benefits-related free school meal due to your low family income.

### How do I redeem the voucher?

- 1. Blackhawk Network will email you a 16-digit code. This will be sent to the email address your child's school has on their records. Please keep an eye on your inbox and check your junk or spam folder. If we do not hold an email address for you, your code will be texted or posted to you.
- 2. When you have received your code, go to <a href="www.ealingcouncil.select-your-reward.co.uk">www.ealingcouncil.select-your-reward.co.uk</a>
- 3. Type in your unique 16-digit code on the homepage and click 'Redeem'
- 4. Make your selection and click 'Checkout'
- 5. Enter a valid email address where your confirmation and voucher will be sent.
- 6. Review and accept the terms and conditions before placing your order.

7. Once you have placed your order, your voucher will be emailed to you within 24 hours.

8. You can use your voucher either online or in store

### Where can I spend the voucher?

You can choose where you spend your voucher. The voucher can be used at the following retailers: Tesco, Sainsbury's, Asda, Morrisons, Waitrose, M&S and Aldi. The voucher should be used to purchase food and essential clothing, for example, school uniform and should not be spent on non-essential items. Prices vary from one place to another so you might want to consider comparing prices for the items you need before deciding which supermarket to use.

### **Expiry dates**

Voucher codes are only valid for three months from the date of issue but once redeemed you then have between one and five years to spend the voucher, depending on which retailer you choose. So please do ensure you redeem your voucher code well ahead of the expiry date and contact Blackhawk in plenty of time if you have not received your voucher.

**Read Easy Ealing**, a branch of Read Easy UK, provides adults in the borough of Ealing who struggle to read with free one-to-one reading coaching.

Not being able to read very well - or at all - self-evidently creates huge barriers for adults to achieve their potential - whether for career purposes, in their relationships or for personal growth. Imagine not being able to help your own child or grandchild with their reading. Imagine not being able to use a computer. Or not being able to apply for jobs you could do perfectly well if you were able to read. Or not being able to enjoy a great story or learn new skills and knowledge through studying.

If you know of any adults in your school's community who speak English but who struggle to read, please ask them to get in touch with us or get their agreement for you to contact us on their behalf. We have trained, local volunteer coaches ready and waiting to help with twice-weekly, half-hour tuition sessions close to people's homes.
