Gospel: 4:12-23



Jesus calls his the fishermen to leave everything to follow him

As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea-for they were fishermen. And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people." Immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed him. Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

Year 6 World War II Workshop

On Wednesday, Year Six took part in a WWII workshop hosted by Carl, a former soldier and keen historian. The children loved the day and participated fully throughout. The day began with a breakdown of how Hitler came to power, the events that happened in Europe in the run-up to war and ended with the dropping of the atomic bombs. The children were shown artefacts and learnt about life on the 'Home front' which covered the role of women during the war, air raids, evacuation and rationing. After lunch, some pupils were given the opportunity to wear the equipment and uniforms of a British soldier whilst Carl taught them about weaponry and ammunition. The day ended with a spot of code-breaking inspired by the great minds who helped win the war at Bletchley Park. Thank you to Mrs Baran for organising the workshop and to Mrs Ingham, Ms Smith and Mrs Whybrew for inspiring the children.

- Look after them and yourself: take time to do the things you enjoy!
