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'Living with COVID-19' plan

The Government has published its plan for COVID-19 and also reduced COVID-19 restrictions. In line with this, and also because our case numbers have reduced significantly, adults are no longer required to wear face coverings when they collect children, but I would recommend that you continue to do so. We should all be considerate of others who may be at risk or vulnerable. Adults will still be required to wear face coverings when attending class assemblies indoors.

Children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with others for at least 5 full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days. I am sure that you will agree that a pupil with key symptoms of COVID-19 should not attend school, given the potential risk to others.
