Laudato Si' project – Caring for our common home

Following on from last week, where we thought about which items have been essential to our everyday living, this week we can think about product choice. When you come to the point where you need to replace essential items, can you make a more sustainable choice? Perhaps you could make the switch to eco-friendly cleaning products, or make a choice to choose wooden items in place of plastic – tables, chairs, hairbrushes, toys, single-use cutlery, even sunglasses – all are available in hard wearing, more environmentally friendly materials. Bags, napkins, picnic wear, cloths are all available in compostable materials. Household appliances such as washing machines often come with energy efficiency ratings. When you need to invest in big purchases that won't be replaced for years can you make the most sustainable choice?

Challenge: When you make a purchase, consider the item's life expectancy: How long can the item be used? Will it have more than one use? When you're done with it, will it end up in the rubbish? Is there a non-plastic alternative? Start investing in reusable products for the items you most often throw away.

In the event...

In the event that somebody in your household wakes up with a fever (>37.8°C), or a new, continuous cough or a loss of the sense of smell or taste do not send your child to school.

Immediately inform the school via email or phone and then book a test for the person. The whole household must then self-isolate. If the test returns negative and nobody has any ongoing

symptoms, the child can return to school and the household no longer needs to self-isolate. If a positive result is returned, the household must self-isolate for 10 days and resume normal activity after 10 days as long as they have been symptom free for 48 hours.

If your child has a sniffle, runny nose or is sneezing, they are not coronavirus symptoms and your child should come to school if well enough.
