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## Punctuality

I worked in the office on Tuesday morning and there were 36 children late. I was taken aback considering the majority of those children live within a 10 minute walk of the school. On the face of it, your child being late to school may not seem disruptive. However, the teacher has to stop teaching the class, update the latecomer and then carry on. Now if this was an isolated incident, not ideal, but they happen. When you have two or three children arriving late in a class at different times, this disrupts the learning for all the other children who were there on time, two or three times. If this happens in the Lower Phase during Phonics for example, it is very detrimental to the whole class. Please make an effort to have your child in school and on time.

## Attendance

This week I met with our attendance officer from Ealing who went through our autumn attendance figures. She was generally happy as the majority of children were between 90% and 100%. Although our target is 96%, children currently between 85% and 90% should easily be able to pick up their percentages as the year progresses. It becomes more difficult the lower the percentage becomes. Please have a look at the table below to see how attendance affects your child's learning. The percentages in red are startling and should be an eye opener for parents of children who currently have attendance figures below 85%. On the plus side, there is still time to improve attendance figures. However, if you are having problems with bringing your child into school, let me know and we can have a look at any issues.

When Jesus heals the man in Capernaum, people recognise the power of his message

Jesus and his disciples went to Capernaum; and when the sabbath came, he entered the synagogue and taught. They were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes. Just then there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit, and he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? ### Re: rise in measles in north-west London

In the last few weeks there has been an increase in the number of cases of measles in north-west London, including a few among Ealing children. Measles is extremely infectious and can cause serious illnesses, including pneumonia and meningitis.

#### Immunisation

Make sure your child gets two MMR vaccines on time; the first at 1 year old and the second at 3 years, 4 months. Having both doses gives long lasting protection against measles, mumps, and rubella. You can find more information about the MMR vaccine on the <u>NHS website</u> or if you have any questions or worries about vaccinations, here's a <u>video link</u> that helps explain them.

If you or your child missed these vaccines, it's not too late. Ask for a free vaccine from your family doctor (GP) if you or your children aren't up to date. If you are unsure if your child is up to date with all their routine immunisations, please check their 'red book' (personal child health record) or contact your GP practice. Your GP or practice nurse will be able to review your child's immunisation status and answer questions about immunisation.

### Symptoms of measles

If you have symptoms of measles, stay at home and phone your GP or NHS 111 for advice. Stay away from GP surgeries and A&E departments – you could spread the illness to others.

Symptoms include: high fever; sore, red, watery eyes; coughing; aching and feeling generally unwell; and a blotchy red brown rash, which usually appears after the first symptoms.

Please note that when children are feeling unwell, most of the time, they can still attend school, and should be encouraged to do so. It is usually appropriate for parents and





carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat.

However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. If you are unsure, please seek advice by calling NHS 111 or your GP.

### Contact with a measles case

The UK Health Security Agency will be notified of all cases of measles and advise on the public health management including contact tracing. Please note that if your child has not had one dose of MMR vaccine and someone else in the same house gets measles, they will not be able to go to school for 21 days after contact with the infected person (the time infection can take to develop).
