### **Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy**


Duchenne muscular dystrophy (DMD) is a severe, genetic disorder which is characterised by progressive muscle weakness and wasting and one of the children at St Joseph's has it. ### Music at Royal Albert Hall

On Tuesday afternoon, our school choir travelled to the iconic Royal Albert Hall in London to take part in 'Ealing Together – Harmony in Diversity' – a mass-music event organised by Ealing Music Service. Performers included Ealing Symphony Orchestra, Ealing Youth Orchestra, Cadenza (the junior ensemble), Ealing Youth Jazz Orchestra and Ealing Youth Big Band. Our school choir added to the biggest choir they'll ever sing in – over 1,000 voices! The talent on show was tremendous - how lucky Ealing is to have so many amazing musicians at such young ages!

The programme for the choir was a real mix of musical styles: 'O Fortuna' by Carl Orff; 'Adiemus' by living Welsh composer Karl Jenkins; 'Big Idea/Celebrate Together' – a song particularly suited to primary school choirs; and the world premiere of 'Ada in Ealing' composed for the occasion by local composer, Laura Rossi, with words by Michael Rosen who was there in person as one of the narrators 'Wikipedia'!

It was a wondrous experience for the twenty children representing our school as the choir - they even had the rare treat of hearing the mighty organ - nicknamed 'The Voice of Jupiter' - with its 9,999 pipes, it's the largest in the UK! Our children performed brilliantly and showed such dedication having already been to a Saturday rehearsal as well as regular after-school choir sessions, learning many of the works by heart. A big thank you to the parents for finding the group in the crowd at the end and promptly collecting their children - it was well-past everyone's bedtime! An even bigger thank you to Mrs. Ingham and Mr. Wesolowski for preparing the children and giving up huge chunks of time to make it a success.







## **Healthy Activity and Food Programme (HAF)**

Soon we will receive a delivery of HAF postcards which will be distributed to children who are entitled to benefit related free school meals. The programme now uses a new booking system for the Summer HAF. Codes are no longer needed, so these will not be included with the postcard delivery. Eligible pupils (those receiving benefits-related free school meals) will be automatically added to the booking system. Eligible families will also be emailed directly with further booking information. Please note that primary pupils receiving the universal free school meals offer are not eligible for the HAF programme. 




