Self-isolation payments

From the Government - Many children are being sent home from schools across the



country because someone in their class or year-group bubble has tested positive for coronavirus. If so, and you - the parent - can't work as you need to be with them, this can trigger the £500 isolation payment for those on low incomes. Click on link for further information:

School Meals payment portal

The current online meals payment portal will no longer be available to make payments for meals beyond the 31st of July 2021. If you are paying for your child's meal online please do not make any payments beyond the 23rd of July 2021. The current online payment portal is being replaced with the ISS new online payment portal, details of which will be sent to you at a later date.



If you have credit on your Harrison account beyond the 23rd of July 2021 or when our school closes for the summer holidays, the payments team will be in touch to refund your money.

In the event...

In the event that somebody in your household wakes up with a fever (>37.8°C), or a new, continuous cough or a loss of the sense of smell or taste do not send your child to school. Immediately inform



the school via email or phone and then book a test for the person. If this were to happen at the weekend, email head@stjosephs.ealing.sch.uk. The whole household must then self-isolate. If the test returns negative and nobody has any ongoing symptoms, the child can return to school and the household no longer needs to self-isolate. If a positive result is returned, the household must self-isolate for 10 days and resume normal activity after 10 days as long as they have been symptom free for 48 hours.

If your child has a sniffle, runny nose or is sneezing, they are not coronavirus symptoms and your child should come to school if well enough.


