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
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All Saints' Mass


Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

Reminders!

Uniform – We are now in the second half of the autumn term and the children are required to be in winter uniforms, no more polo shirts or summer dresses. Children need to be wearing black school shoes, no trainers or boots please. When the weather is bad, they may come in boots or wellies but then need to change into shoes at school.

Nuts - We are a nut free school; do not send your child in to school with nut products in their lunch boxes. Some of our children who have allergies may have a severe reaction.





Safer Street

You will no doubt have noticed the cameras that have been installed, even if one is currently in slightly the wrong place. That said, enforcement has begun using the cameras and the council even sent a camera car over to re-inforce the point.

I am sure that you will already have noticed that York Avenue is a far more welcoming environment for everyone to use, especially families who walk or cycle to school and far safer than it used to be for the whole community. Please remember though that it is a **Low Traffic Zone** not a No Traffic Zone so please follow road safety rules.

I received a lovely email from a parent recently. I will leave it anonymous but it captures the feelings of many parents I have talked to:

Dear Mr. Rakowski,

Thank you and your team so much for all the hard work in getting the school street scheme set up. The school street has transformed the atmosphere on York and Balfour Avenues. I know several parents who now find they don't need to drop their children off right at the school gates any more.

It has made a huge contribution to my children's safety and well-being and I am sure the residents of York Avenue will be including you in their Christmas card lists this year!

With both locations being covered by cameras now, the permits that I was able to issue previously are no longer valid. I have already sent out a letter to parents on instructions on how to get dispensation from the council if, for instance, you are a Blue Badge holder and need access during the closure times. I fully accept there may be other instances that parents would need to drop off their child in unusual circumstances e.g. broken limbs. Black History Month

Last month, we celebrated Black History Month across the school but all the wonderful displays were put up after the newsletter was published. I include the displays now which show off who the children were learning about and some of their work is also pictured.

Nursery looked at the work that Mo Farah has done. Not only is he the most decorated athlete in British athletics history but now he also spends a lot of time helping children who are in need.



Reception focused on Marcus
Rashford. We all know what wonderful
things he has done recently. He almost
singlehandedly made the Government
make a U-Turn of free school meals. He
has also supported charities that help children.



Year 1 studied Usain Bolt. Although now retired from running, he is considered to be the greatest sprinter of all time holding World Records in the 100 metres sprint, 200 metres sprint and 4 × 100 metres relay. He is not known so much for the work he has done back home in Jamaica and around the world helping children who struggle with their learning.



Year 2 looked at Mary Seacole who was a nurse. She was born just over 200 years ago but is famous for the way that she looked after injured soldiers in the Crimean War. She spent a lot of her own money to make sure the injured soldiers could be looked after.



Year 3 studied Stormzy. Mostly known for his music, Stormzy is now becoming more known for the work he is doing to help underprivileged children making sure they have access to learning. His foundation teaches children to have aspirations and goals to achieve. He funds young people to go to university.




Year 4 focused on gymnast Simone Biles who is one of the most decorated gymnasts of all time. When she was growing up and pursuing her gymnastic career she came across many barriers but overcame them to be known worldwide. She now encourages children to follow their dreams and never to give up wanting to achieve their goals.



Year 5 researched the work of Didier Drogba. The former Chelsea striker has become a sporting ambassador and has had a huge effect on many youngsters, he even stopped a war! He is now being remembered for helping children. A lovely quote from him shows his charitable nature, "Money doesn't make me feel rich, it's in helping others that I feel rich."



Year 6 worked together to study Millie Dunne Veasey. She was a soldier during the 2nd World War who served in the Women's Army Corps and the Women's Auxiliary Army Corps. After returning home from World War II, she worked in the civil rights movement and helped to promote women.

On Friday 22nd October, the Year 6 netball team took part in a high-five netball tournament at Ellen Wilkinson School for Girls. They played 6 matches in total, winning every match and earning themselves first place in the competition.
