On Wednesday, the College of Cardinals began the Conclave to select our next Pope. They requested that we pray for them, so that they may listen to the Holy Spirit as they discerned whom to elect as the next Pope. There prayers were clearly answered as yesterday, white smoke floated over the Vatican signifying the election of a new Pope - Car-

nifying the election of a new Pope - Cardinal Robert Prevost has been elected as Pope Leo XIV. We will keep Pope Leo XIV in our prayers for his work with the Church.





#### **Father Julio**

On Tuesday, Father Julio came to visit the children in the Early Years to talk about our church. He showed the children the oils used in Baptism and the host and chalice used during mass. He explained the importance of candles, which represents the light of Jesus. The children were beautifully behaved and were eager to ask Father Julio questions.
