|            | The Headteacher talked about the return to school and said:  - Children are happy to be back in school and have settled well.  |  |
|            | - Reception children have been settled in over a 2-week period rather than 3 weeks, this gets the children learning more quickly.  |  |
|            | <ul> <li>46 children from Nursery went into Reception.</li> <li>Pupil numbers: currently have 587 pupils and 43 spaces, which is roughly 2 pupils down per class across the year. If that becomes 3 pupils down, then it becomes a strain on resources.</li> </ul> |  |
|            | Governor said pupil numbers look ok in the younger year groups.<br>Headteacher agreed.   |  |

|    | <ul> <li>33 pupils in Nursery made up of 14 30hr children, 9 in the morning session and 10 in the afternoon session.</li> <li>Admin team have done a sterling job recruiting children. Some of the children are coming from local schools.</li> <li>Ofsted are currently 3 or 4 terms behind schedule; we may be due an inspection from summer to next autumn/spring.</li> <li>Staff are glad to be back, there were a few concerns. The Risk Assessment was validated by staff at the inset.</li> <li>One staff member has left, and interviews have taken place but there was no successful candidate. A specialised temp will be put in place in the interim.</li> <li>An SMSA will be recruited to cover nursery lunch.</li> <li>TLR PE position has been given up by a staff member.</li> <li>2 staff with Covid</li> <li>Curriculum pamphlets have been sent out to parents.</li> <li>£6,060 premium recovery grant has been received and teachers have been working with phase leaders to organise interventions for children on pupil premium.</li> <li>Governor asked if the children receiving interventions will be monitored and progress shown. The Headteacher said yes.</li> <li>Health and Safety - the one-way system has remained in the upper phase and in the stair well. Parents are picking up children in a different way. Fire drills will take place when site staff return from holiday.</li> </ul> |     |

The Headteacher said any change to the girls' trousers would take a long time because both uniform shops would need time to get rid of their stock.  Headteacher said when parents replace uniform, they should buy the new logo.  Governor said it is important to have a clear uniform policy. |  |
