## Expectations of pupils

#### · Be prompt

Gate opens 8:35; Gate shuts at 8:45 Registration closes at 8:50; Lessons begin at 8:50

## · Be prepared

Have materials with them and know due dates.

## · Be a polite and positive participant

Speaking audibly and listen attentively.

## · Be productive

Hand in work on time, and always do their best.

## · Be a problem solver

Correct problems quickly and peacefully before they escalate.

## Attendance & Punctuality

 Email is the most efficient way of informing the school of absences due to illness or appointments.

- Please do this as early as possible as registers are checked first thing due to some children walking to school on their own.
- Attendance is expected to be 96% and above. Any less and it will impact your child's learning.
- A phone call is sufficient for absences due to sickness.
   'Feeling sick' is not an acceptable reason.

#### DfE -

'Evidence shows students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school — both primary and secondary — gain the best GCSE and A-level results.'

The data also shows that primary school children in 2019 who didn't achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths missed on average four days more than those whose performance exceeded expectations. 4 days in a year was the difference between exceeding and underachieving!

Data from 2019 showed that 84% of Key Stage 2 pupils who had 100% attendance achieved the expected standard, compared to 40% of pupils who were persistently absent.

## Uniforms

- Labels on ALL clothing, including coats, scarves etc.
- Y6 come to school in their PE kit and trainers on Tuesdays (shorts for indoor PE) and Thursdays
- · On Monday, Wednesday and Friday, SHOES must be worn with school uniform
- A pair of plimsolls need to be left in the locker for indoor PE.
- No jewellery apart from plain studs are to be worn in school. This includes fancy hair accessories.
- Hair that is long enough to touch the shoulders should be tied back at all times. This applies to ALL children.
- · Children may wear a watch; this will be removed in P.E.




## Homework
