






Christmas decorations

I really want it to snow and I will throw a ball at Daddy.





In Art we have been learning about Roman Gods. We also learnt about Narcissus and Echo.



Year 5


Hi Guys!

Geometry is a branch of mathematics that studies sizes, shapes, positions, angles and dimensions of things. It also comes from Ancient Greece.

SO, here are our top tips for you:


- Do not listen to music walking around or on the bus because you won't be able to hear the dangers around you.
