Doctors help people feel better. They have stethoscope and they have thermometer.


















































Year 1
















- RMS Titanic was the largest ship afloat at the time of its maiden voyage on April 10 1912.
- It was built by Belfast ship building firm Harland and Wolff. It took 3 years to build. It was described as unsinkable!
- On 10th April 1912, the Titanic departed from Southampton on its maiden voyage. It sailed across the Atlantic Ocean towards New York in the USA.
- This giant cruise ship could take over 2000 passengers, had 3 classes for accommodation. The first class was designed to be very comfortable and luxury with gymnasium, swimming pool, libraries, restaurants and much more.
- The accommodation for the third class was located in the lower decks and the noise and vibrations of the engine could be heard and felt. Can you imagine how that would be?
 - Titanic was under the command of Captain Edward Smith.
- On 14th April, 4 days into the crossing, the ship hit an iceberg, after 2 hours broke apart and sank with over 1000 people.
 About 700 survivors.
 - There were not enough lifeboats for all the passengers.
- The disaster was met with world-wide shock at the huge loss of life.




Year 4

How many people died?


Where were these earthquakes?

It even damaged the whole road where I lived in a huge beautiful house. That was the best place I ever had when I lived there.



Do you know how they are formed? A fossil when an animal dies or becomes extinct and the remains (which are hard bones) are left lying on the ground and are covered by leaves, mud, earth and more stuff like that. After a long time, the remains are well underground and the Earth starts to change (by change I mean move around). After hundreds of years, the remains are petrified. This means turned to stone! Centuries later, paleontologists dig them up and study them so we can learn more about the animal.





Year 6 were evacuated!



Hi everyone — this is Brian and Ola speaking, from 6J.

On 24th March, the whole of year six time travelled all the way back to 1939. We were invited to come into school dressed as evacuees so we dressed in clothes which children would normally wear at this time (t-shirts, shorts and trousers, skirt and dresses). We had our gas masks all ready for departure and our name tags too. Don't be surprised, but the teachers also dressed up! We had soo much fun!

On evacuee day, the first thing we did was replying to 'Aunt Nancy's' letter. Before this lesson, each of us were given a woman's job role and we had to research it in detail — I got a factory worker! Then, we answered all of Aunt Nancy's questions about our job into our History books.

After break, we lined up and took a trip to Hanwell Train Station. We re-traced the steps that children from St Joseph's would have taken during their evacuation — we learnt about this when we looked at our school log book. When we were there, we took lots of photos and walked through the tunnel pretending we were saying goodbye to our parents.

At 11:30, we received a letter from Winston Churchill addressing us. We had to figure out a way to free 4000 troops from Dunkirk in a mission called Operation Dynamo. We had three mission to complete.

Choose which boats to use (making sure we do not leave anyone behind)

Calculate how long it will take them to get there (Distance / Speed = Time)

Work out if each section had enough money in their budget to equip each soldier.

Once this was done, our mission was complete ©














Year 6




St Joseph's Day

Friday 19th March 2021




The week after the Easter holidays, week commencing 19th April, will be Eco-Week. Get ready to take part in lots of exciting activities!


