### Claude Monet





#### Here are some interesting facts about Egypt:


- Egypt is home to one of the world's earliest and greatest civilisations.

Year 5




#### Year 6

Conductor means - a material or device that holds electricity.








Did you know that it was almost called 'Alice in Elf Land'? It's such a weird name compared to the one we all know nowadays.




















### Meet the Office Staff


### 19th - 23rd April ECO WEEK 2021
