Enjoy the summer holidays!




Did you know?

Year 2




Hello. My name is Zuzanna and I'm in Year 2. In this edition, I will teach you how to use the formal written method in Maths.

Formal Written Method 83-54 = 29

- **Step 1:** Write out your place value columns and then write the tens digit under the tens column and the ones digit under the ones column.
- **Step 2:** Start with the ones column. Check whether you can subtract bottom number from the top one. (Can you take 4 away from 3?)
- **Step 3:** If you can't, you need to take one ten from the tens column and bring it over to the ones column. Now, in my ones column I have one ten and 3 which is 13.
- **Step 4:** You need to work out 13 4 (write your answer in the ones column). In the tens column, you do 7 5 and you write 2 under the tens column. **Answer:** 29
- **Step 5:** Don't forget to use the inverse operation to check your answer.

Some people liked the haunted gallery because they got spooked out and they liked to do it.


I think my favourite part was Henry's Apartment and Base Court.

This half term in Art, we have been learning all about David Hockney. **David Hockney** (born 9 July 1937) is an English painter, draftsman, printmaker, stage designer and photographer. As an important contributor to the pop art movement of the 1960s, he is considered one of the most influential British artists of the 20th century.





We looked at lots of his artwork and we saw that he uses new electronics to draw. He is also well-known for his countryside and landscape paintings. We looked at how Hockney uses squiggly lines to show the texture in his work and also bright colours (he was inspired by Picasso). In Art, we first created a colour wheel where we learnt how to mix colours. Then we made squiggly lines in our book just like David Hockney. After we planned some landscapes, we were given an A3 piece of paper, where we drew and painted our own landscape inspired by Hockney. When the background was dry, we went back to paint on the texture. We all really enjoyed doing the colour mixing and painting our work.

In D&T, our project is to make a bag which will be used to hold all our production props. On to Wimbledon ...


Djokovic won Wimbledon male and Ashleigh Barty won for women's.


