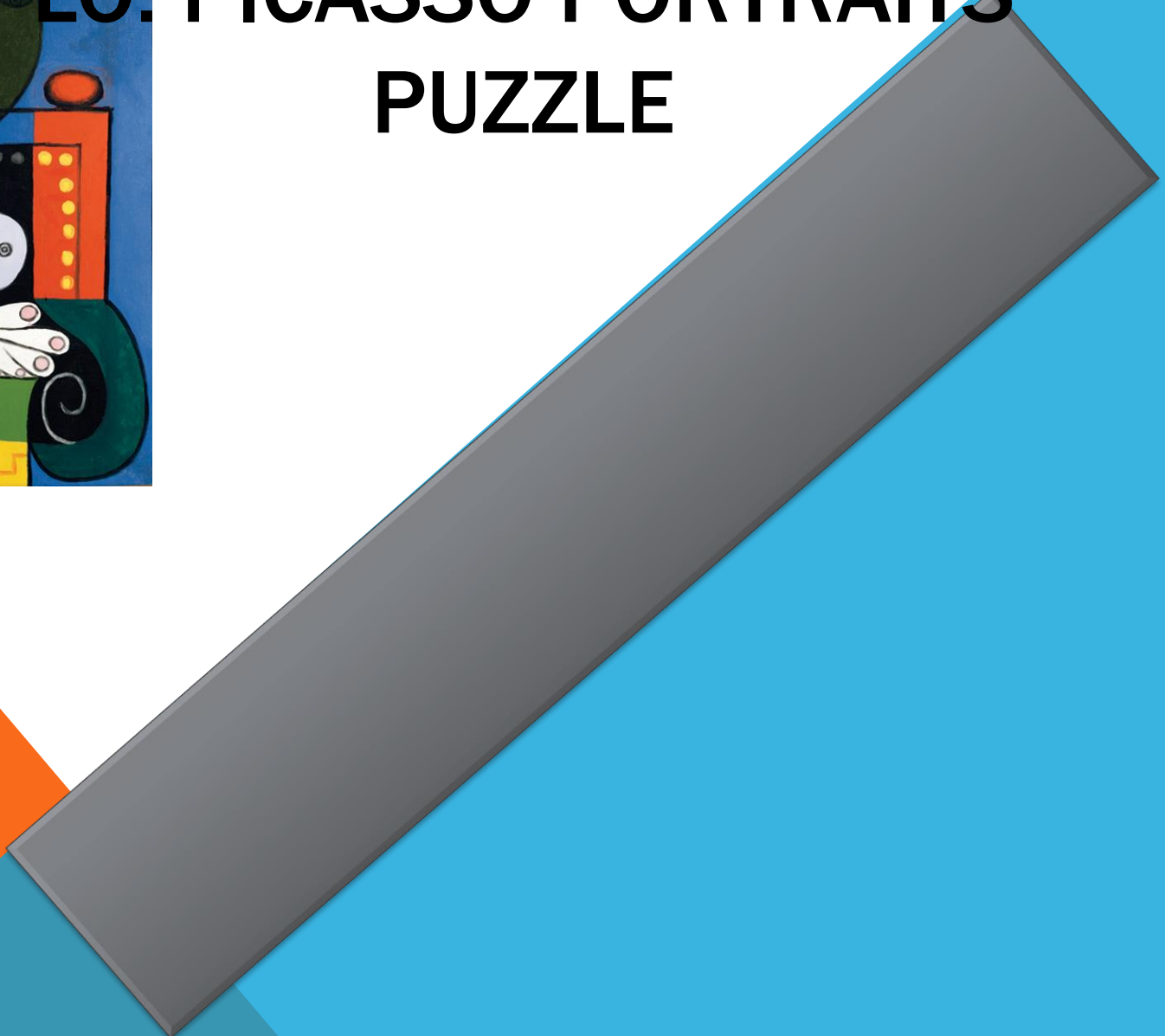
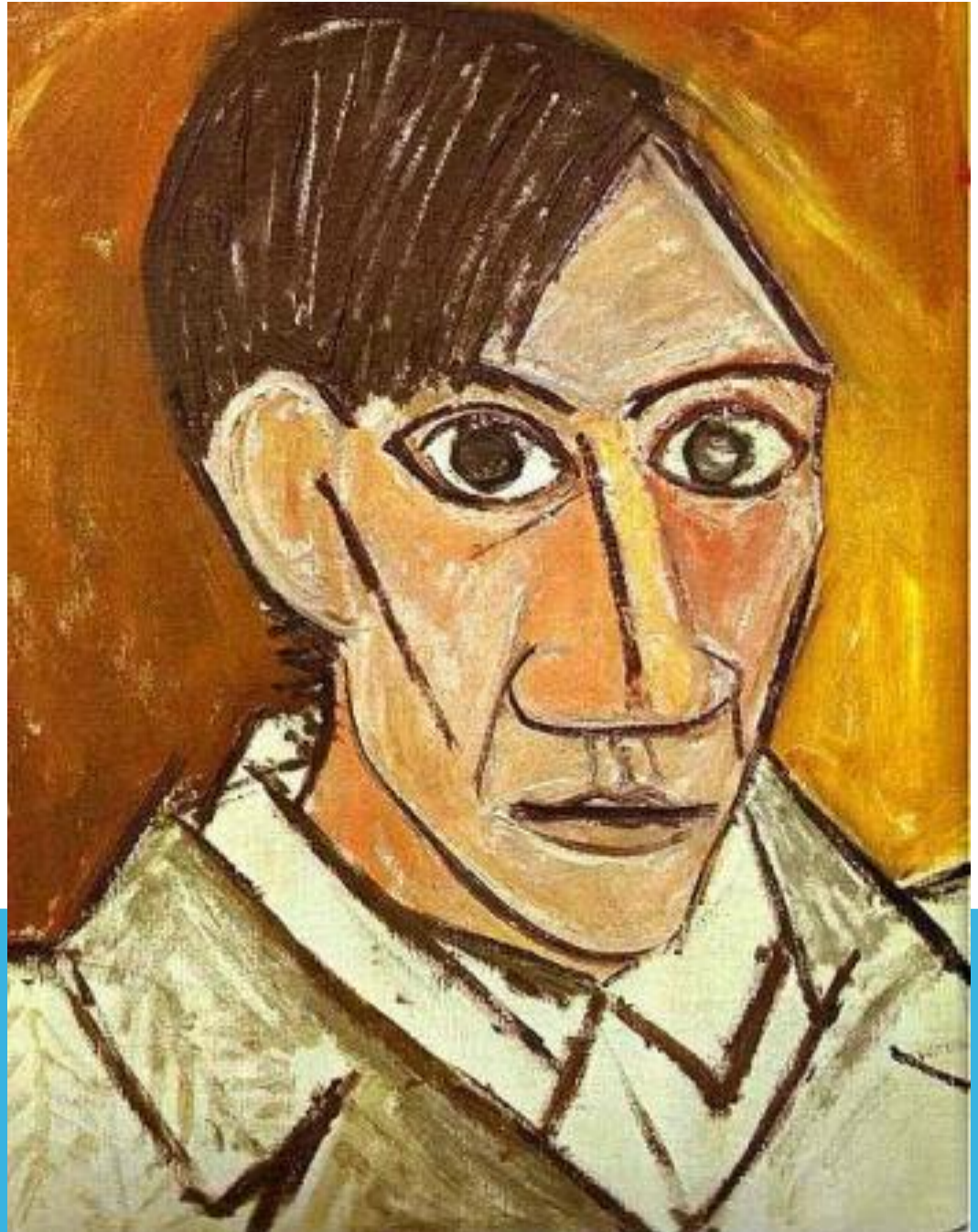


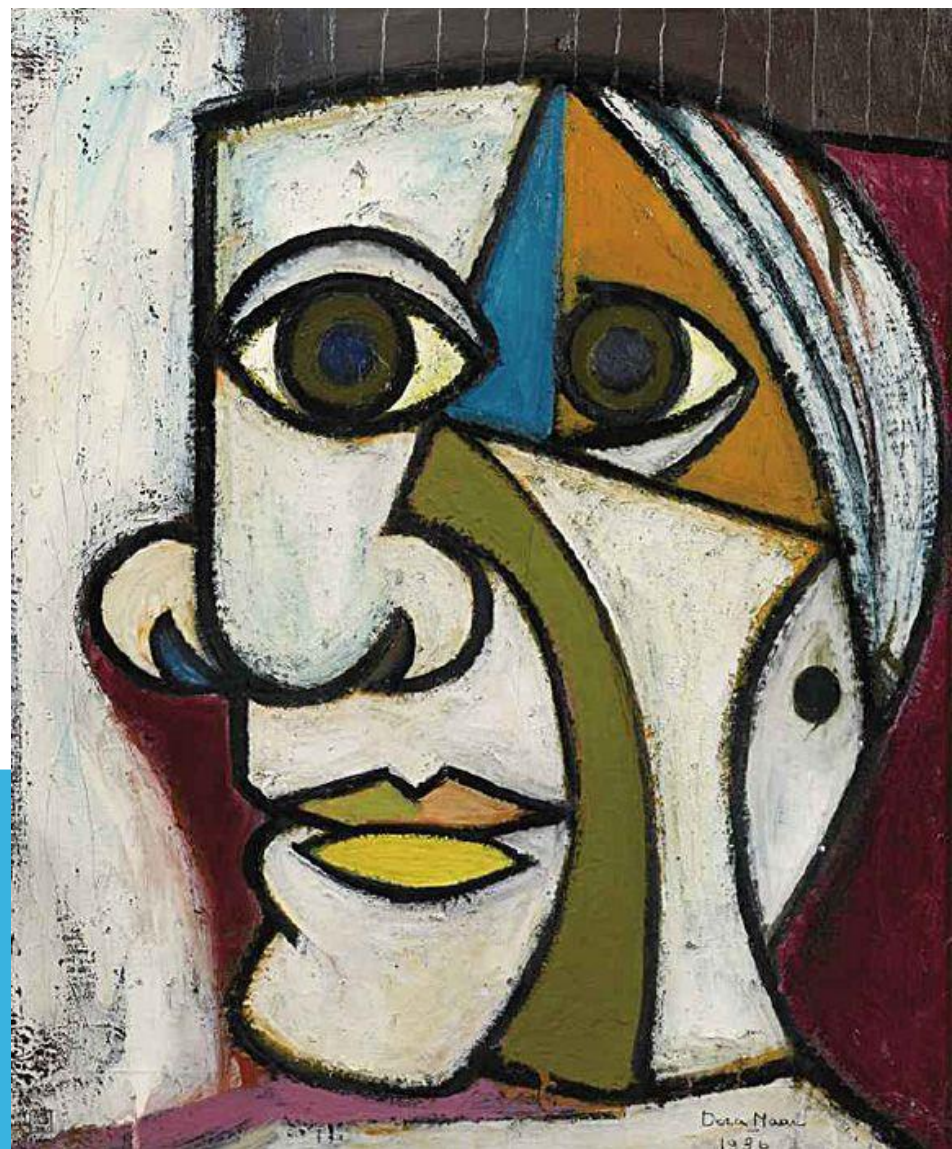
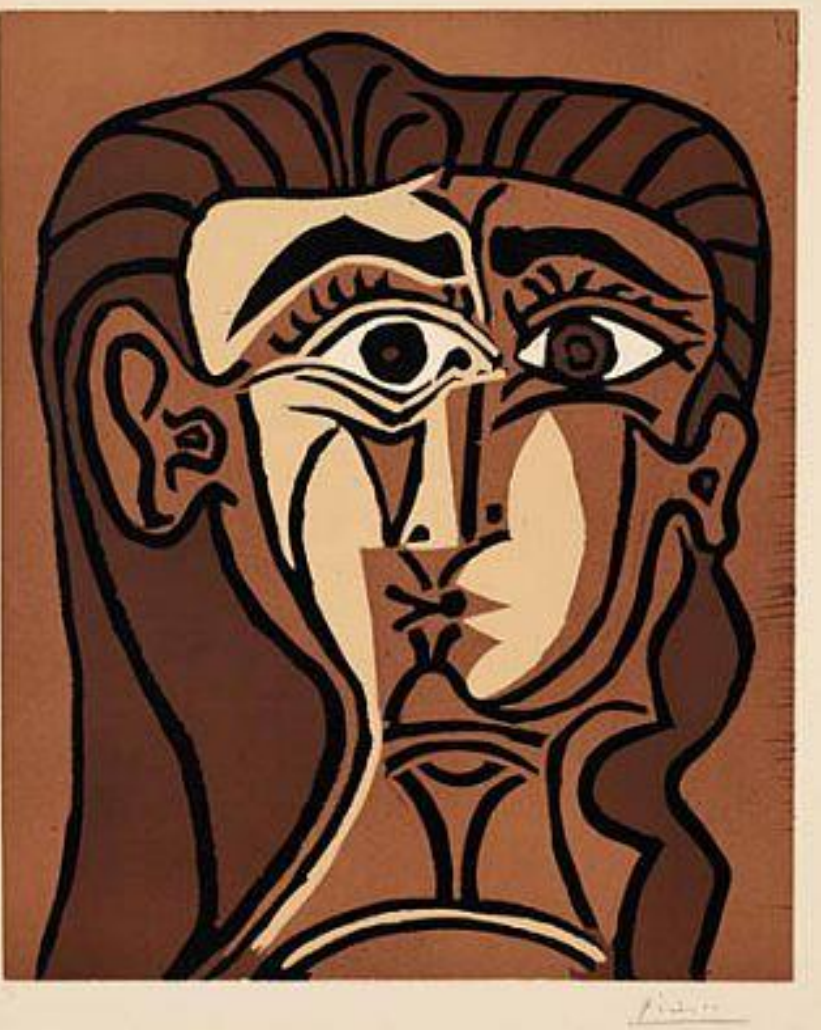


LO: PICASSO PORTRAITS PUZZLE



Let's look at
some of
Picasso's
portraits.











Today, we are going to have some fun with Picasso portraits!










You will need:

- 2 A5 piece of plain paper (cut an A4 piece in half)
- Colours (pens, pencils, crayons, pastels, paints whichever you like!)
- Scissors
- Glue



The first thing you will need to do, is draw 2 portraits in a Picasso style. Let's watch this video to get some inspiration...

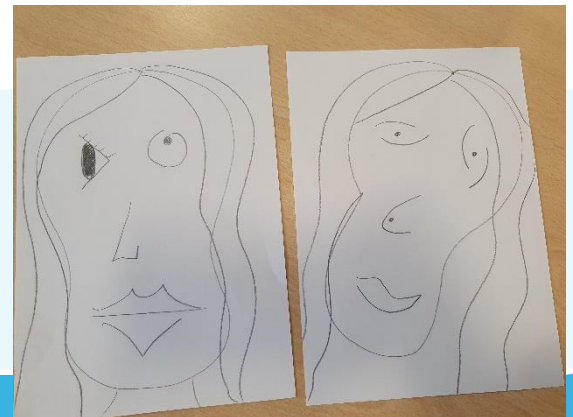

TASK: FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS TO CREATE YOUR PICASSO PORTRAIT PUZZLE

On both pieces of A5 paper, draw a portrait in the style of Picasso. It can be a self-portrait or a portrait of a family member. They portraits **do not have to be identical!**

Tip: Make the face quite big as the background needs to be coloured too!



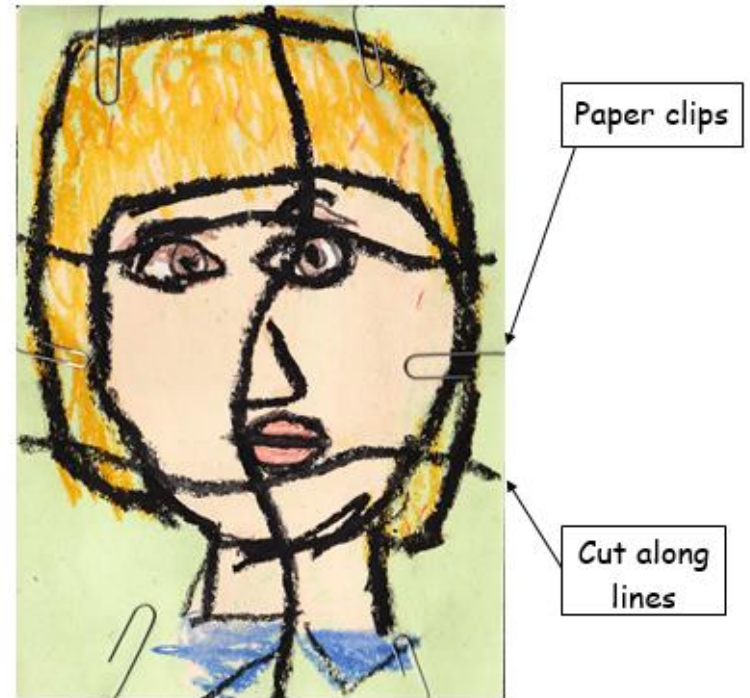
Next, colour both portraits and the background too!
You can use the same or different colours!
Remember to design the background in a Picasso style too.

Tip: Once you have coloured the portrait and background, go over the features of the face with a black marker (if possible)



Place both of your art pieces on top of each other and hold them together with paper clips.

Now (you don't have to draw the lines), cut these two pieces of work into 4 or 6 sections.



Now you have cut up the portraits, put them back together again like a puzzle - you can mix and match from the different portraits!!

Try a few different variations - then stick 1 portrait into your art book.



What you need to do:

1. Draw a portrait on both piece of A5 paper. Colour them in using bold colours (including the background too).
2. Go over the facial features in a thick marker.
3. Put the portraits on top of each other and cut them both into 4 or 6 section.
4. Put the portraits back together again to create 2 new portraits. Play around with this and then stick 1 portrait into your Art book.
