Christmas Care Box

As we move into the season of Advent, our school community would like to offer a small gesture that we are thinking of others by giving a local care home a Christmas Care Box. During this time of the 'new normal', many people living in care homes have not been in close contact with members of their family or other members of the community for months. It has been widely publicised through the press and TV that residence living in a care home have been espe-

cially affected by feelings of isolation and loneliness. To give them a sense that the local community are thinking of them, each class are going to put together a 'Christmas Care Box' which will be full of small gifts that can be distributed to the residence over the Christmas period. We would like you to send a small gift to school, for example a small Christmas decoration, small novelty Christmas chocolate, handkerchiefs, warm socks, crossword puzzle books. These are just a few examples, but can you remember that the gifts are for elderly people. The boxes will be completed by Friday 11th December. We are sure that the children will really enjoy doing this and can we say a big thank you for your continued support.

New, updated "In the event..."

In the event that somebody in your household wakes up with a fever (>37.8°C), or a new, continuous cough or a loss of the sense of smell or taste do not send your child to school. Immediately inform the school via email or phone and then book a test for the person. The whole household must then self-isolate. If the test returns negative and nobody has any ongoing symptoms, the child can return to school and the household no longer needs to self-isolate. If a positive

result is returned, the household must self-isolate for 14 days but the positive case can resume normal activity after 10 days as long as they have been symptom free for 48 hours.

If your child has a sniffle, runny nose or is sneezing, they are not coronavirus symptoms and your child should come to school if well enough.

Christmas cards can be a lovely way to tell our friends and our family that we are thinking about them at this special time of year. Each year many children write out 30 cards to their classmates and teacher. That is 30 x 30 cards and envelopes. **900** in total per class! If everyone in our school from Year 1 - 6 did this, then this will mean that **16,200** cards and envelopes will be written. Where do these cards end up after Christmas?

Last year at St. Joseph's we decided to make a change. The pupils were delighted to read out their cards to the class and see the class cards on display – all in the knowledge that they were making a difference to the planet.

Let's give Planet Earth a happier Christmas by reducing our paper waste.


Challenge: We are asking that children create/ write one 'whole class' Christmas card.

Winter Grant Scheme

You will be aware that the government has announced a Covid Winter Grant Scheme to support children, families and the most vulnerable over winter including those eligible for free school meals. Further guidance is due shortly and I will let you know as soon as possible. In the meantime, I want to remind parents that they need to register for free school meals if they qualify due to low income. Children receiving universal infant free school meals (UIFSM) are not entitled to benefits-related free school meals.

forward to this afternoon and ensuring they are complying with the PTA's pens/ pencils down afternoon. As promised, the children will not do any writing in any lessons after lunch.
