Primary School Tests

Year 6 SATs are still going ahead but the Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar (SPAG) test is cancelled. Reading, Writing and Maths teacher assessment will remain for KS1 children but no KS1 SAT tests this academic year; Phonics testing will still take place.

In the event...

In the event that somebody in your household wakes up with a fever (>37.8°C), or a new, continuous cough or a loss of the sense of smell or taste do not send your child to school. Immediately inform the school via email or phone and then book a test for the person. The whole household must then self-isolate. If the test returns negative and nobody has any ongoing symptoms, the child can return to school and the household no longer needs to self-isolate. If a positive result is returned, the household must self-isolate for 14 days but the positive case can resume normal activity after 10 days as long as they have been symptom free for 48 hours.



'Laudato Si' project - Caring for our common home

With just over three weeks to go until Christmas, many of you will have been busy buying gifts for your loved ones. Please take a moment to consider how you will wrap these gifts. Across the UK it has been estimated that Brits will bin what equates to 108 million rolls of wrapping paper, with the average UK household using 4 rolls of wrapping paper each.

CONTROL OF

Before you wrap consider this:

- Do you have any gift bags/ boxes that you can reuse from previous years?
- Can you avoid paper loaded with glitter? Not only will this save the problem of hoovering later, it also prevents this form of micro-plastic making its way into our seas and affecting marine life. In fact, many UK councils are now rejecting recycling bins containing glitter altogether, deeming the entire load to be 'contaminated'.
- If you are adding ribbons, can you forego the sellotape? This will reduce the use of plastic and will mean that it may be easier for the receiver to reuse their paper.

Challenge: Get inventive with your wrapping. Can you use plain brown paper and add painted pine cones, holly, stamps, or draw pictures to personalise it? Be aware of not using too much paper for one item. Dig out gift bags you have kept and reuse them.

Why not take a photo and send it in with your child to their class teacher to encourage others to play their part too?
