
St Joseph's Catholic Primary School Weekly Newsletter Friday 6th November 2020

"Laudato Si' project - Caring for our common home

The clocks have gone back and the temperature is dropping which isn't good news for energy saving. There is always a spike in energy consumption at this time of year as the evenings become darker and colder and there is an increased need for light and heat. However, we can make an effort to avoid unnecessary energy overuse.

Challenge: Walk around your home. Are there any lights on in rooms with no-one in them? Turn them off. Are the radiators turned up in the bedroom during the day when you are at school? With your parents' permission, ask if you can turn the radiator down in the morning when you make your bed and up again at night when you are using the room.

Why not take a photo and send it in with your child to their class teacher to encourage others to play their part too?

In the event...

In the event that your child wakes up with a fever (>37.8°C), or a new, continuous cough or a loss of the sense of smell or taste do not send them to school. Immediately book your child in for a test and the whole household has to isolate for 14 days. If the child tests positive, they have to stay off school for at least 10 days. If the test is negative, the child

they have to stay off school for at least 10 days. If the test is negative, the child can return to school and the household no longer needs to self-isolate.

If your child has a sniffle, runny nose or is sneezing, they are not coronavirus symptoms and your child should come to school if well enough.

Uniform


I have seen a few polo shirts and remnants of summer uniform this week. Please remember to switch to winter uniform.
