In line with our mission statement, the school's aim is to help children develop their own intrinsic motivation to behave in a manner which builds God's community here and now, brings enjoyment to themselves and their peers, and promotes the learning of all.

However, we recognise that children and their families sometimes need encouragement and guidance to achieve this and our school will always balance the needs of the individual with the good of the community. This addendum to St Joseph's Catholic Primary School Behaviour Policy contains details of our arrangements during the Coronavirus pandemic.

The Behaviour Policy remains the 'go to' document with respect to anything concerning behaviour. However, the additions below are needed to supplement the document for clarity.

Children must:

- Wash your hands regularly, for 20 seconds each time.
- Socially distance yourself 2m away from anyone not in your 'bubble'.
- Stay in your classroom/area, and not touch anyone else.
- Not bring in unnecessary items from home.
- Follow the new routines that are put in place.
- Not share food or drinks from packed lunches.
- Stay in your 'bubble' at playtimes/lunchtimes.

Children who are following the rules will be mindful of others, respectful of adults and their peers and thoughtful about how their actions will impact on those around them.

If children do not follow the instructions:

- Teachers will warn children, and explain what they did incorrectly (all in a way the child/ren can understand).
- A Senior Leader will talk to you and your parents.
- If you deliberately and repeatedly break the rules in a way that makes it unsafe for other children and adults, you may not be allowed to come to school.
