ContinYou Ealing: Parent Partnership Service (CEPPS)

ContinYou Ealing Parent Partnership Service (CEPPS) offers free advice, information, and support to parents and carers of children with special educational needs (SEN) in Ealing. CEPPS prioritises three key areas to empower parents to help their children achieve their full potential:

- Assisting with paperwork to help make SEN policy clear and accessible. This could, for example, include going through forms with parents or helping them to draft letters to the SEN Department.
- Helping parents find the best person/service to assist them with their particular issue. 2. CEPPS can signpost parents to the relevant professionals and/or liaise with them on their behalf.
- Establishing peer-support networks. CEPPS runs parent carer coffee mornings and 3. other events to tackle the sense of social isolation that can come from raising a child with special educational needs. This gives parents the opportunity to meet others in a similar position.

CEPPS can help parer	nts in a variety of ways:
 Advising them of their rights as regards their child's needs and the provision the Local Authority has decided will meet them. Meeting with them to discuss their concerns. Helping them to prepare for forthcoming meetings, e.g. the annual review. Accompanying them to meetings with the school or SEN department and helping to mediate any disputes Support through the statutory assessment, statementing, and annual review process 	 Assisting with issues such as school transfer and exclusions Advising them about the appeals and tribunals processes Providing information about other voluntary organisations Providing information about mainstream and special schools in and outside of the borough. Accompanying them on visits to schools they are considering for their child.

Ealing Services for Children with Additional Needs (ESCAN)

Services for children with disabilities in Ealing are provided by a multi-agency service, called Ealing Services for Children with Additional Needs (ESCAN) This is a joint initiative between NHS Ealing and Ealing Council, which brings together key staff onto one site, creating a specialist centre where families and professionals can access

advice, information and services.

- The service provides one central referral point Having a single referral process for easier access to the right services for your child
- Combines assessments so families do not have to repeat their information to several different professionals
- Co-ordinates appointments, so children can have a number of appointments on the same day if appropriate

The table below shows all the teams involved in ESCAN. They work closely with other related practitioners and professionals such as Schools, Educational Social Workers, Health Visitors, Community Paediatric Nurses and voluntary sector organisations.
