Personal, Social and Emotional <u>Development</u>

- Understanding how other people might be feeling and how our actions influence others.
- Focusing on independence; accessing resources in class, solving our own problems; independent learning in continuous provision.
- Strong emphasis on friendship and how we should treat our friendship. (RSE and Collective Worship)

Literacy

- Focusing on the story 'The Three Little Pigs'
- Retelling the story using Pie Corbett talk4writing actions.
- Daily phonics sessions, children working at phase 2 or phase 3.
- Writing simple sentences.
- Practising pre-cursive letter formation.

Throughout the whole year children will:

- Develop a love of books, stories and reading through story time, guided reading and home reading.
- Know how to handle and care for books.
- Have the opportunity to read phonetically decodable books to an adult at least twice a week.

Expressive Art and Design

- Manipulating and joining materials.
- Constructing with a purpose (a house for the three little pigs)
- Children sing songs, make music and dance, and experiment with ways of changing them.

<u>Maths</u>

- Explore teen numbers understanding their composition e.g. 17 is ten and 7 more through the part, part whole model (the foundations of addition and subtraction)
- Begin to use mathematical models such as a tens frame to represent different quantities.
- Explore capacity, height, length through continuous provision.

Communication and language

Throughout the year children will:

- Learn to speak with confidence during circle/carpet times
- Learn to listen and respond appropriately with relevant comments, questions or actions
- Use appropriate story language to re-enact/re-tell simple and familiar stories
- Learn new vocabulary relating to topics and be encouraged to use it.
- Be encouraged to ask questions to find out more, develop curiosity.
- Take part in our key worker 'Magic moment' group session

All children who require extra support with communication and language skills will take part in our 'Time to Talk' interventions throughout the year.

Understanding the World

- E-safetv.
- Using age appropriate programmes to develop ICT skills.
- Materials investigation (observing the differences and similarities in different materials; wood, straw, bricks)
- Make predictions, carry out the experiment and record results (which material is the strongest).
