

Basic maths skills are essential to your child's progress in school. Please ensure they are practising their times tables on a daily basis until proficient. This could simply be as a question and answer session in the car, adding things up in the supermarket, counting coins in denominations, written 'sums' or possibly internet based games and apps such as TT Rockstars. If children are not able to recite their times tables quickly, it WILL hold them back!

This term in Rivington Class our topic will be 'Space.' We will use Science, Literacy, Music and Art to explore the topic in depth. In Literacy, the children will explore robot characterization as part of their sci-fi story writing. In Science we will explore the links between time and space and some of the strange phenomena that exist in our galaxy.

We will study music related to the theme of space and hopefully compose some music fit for a 'Moon Landing.' This music will then be manipulated as part of our ICT 'audio' topic where the children will learn to add effects to their compositions. In art, the children will practice creating spacescapes with chalk or marbling effects. The children will receive homework activities as and when required either as part of their topic work or Literacy and Maths.
