



<u>Spring Two Topic – Life on the farm</u>

This half term our topic will be Life on the farm! We will be focusing on the story The Little Red Hen who asks her friends for help to make some delicious bread, this story has a huge PSED focus as we talk about how to treat our friends, and we will also look at baking our own bread and writing clear instructions for our recipe book. We will have the amazing experience of watching chicks hatch from eggs and then be tasked with the very important job of looking after them. We will learn all about the lifecycle of a hen and become chicken experts as we learn about their anatomy, what they eat and drink and how to care for them. As we watch our chicks grow we will also be looking for signs of growth outside as we keep our eyes peeled and watch Spring emerge. We will take inspiration from the artist Yayoi Kusama as we create our own polka dot masterpieces

Retell the story, once they have developed a deep familiarity with the text; some as exact repetition and some in their own words. Articulate their ideas and thoughts in well-formed sentences. 	Physical DevelopmentThis half term we will continue our fine motordevelopment with a huge focus on letter formation. Ourgross motor skill will be improving each day as we dig,carry, build, balance and run outside as part of ouroutdoor provision and marathon kids training. We will alsobe finding our inner calm this half term as we half weeklyyoga sessions, learning basic poses and focusing on our breathing.• Continue to develop their fine motor skills so that they can use a range of tools competently, safely and confidently.• Demonstrate strength, balance and coordination when playing.• Form easily recognisable letters.• Become confident using a range of basic yoga poses.

Specific Areas		
Literacy Our focus text this half term is 'The Little Red Hen'. We will begin exploring the story and making predictions as to what might happen next. Next we will create actions (t4w) for the story to help us remember and retell with confidence. We will create our own version of the little red hen, changing aspects of the story in our story map. We will write aspects of the story using our adapted story maps, and linking to our PSED learning we will write letters to the animals telling them how to be a better friend. Comprehension • Make predictions as to what might happen next. • Learn actions for the story 'The little red hen' and retell with confidence using key vocabulary. • Sequence 'The little red hen' using a story map and change an aspect of the story. Reading • Read CVC words, tricky words and simple sentences appropriate to current phonics level. • Develop confidence reading aloud with expression. • Continue to develop a love for books and stories. Writing • Segment simple CVC words and attempt to form the phoneme. • Write simple sentences appropriate to current phonics level. • Continue to practise letter formation to make letter more legible.	Maths In maths this half term we will be consolidating and strengthening our knowledge of number to 10. Continuing to strengthen our understanding of the composition of all numbers to 10, which will then give us a very good foundation when we move on to addition and subtraction calculations. We will also become confident in our knowledge of one more than and one less than within number to 10. Number

 Expressive Art and Design This half term we are focusing on the Japanese artist Yayoi Kusama and her interesting use of polka dots, this will link to our seasons work as our masterpiece will be representing flowers in bloom. We will also continue our love of music as we start our new churanga scheme 'our world'. Explore a range of artists (Yayoi Kusama) Look at art work from the selected artist and discuss what we like/don't like, how we think she has created the art, what tools has she used? Experiment using polka dots to create art, following patterns, experimenting with colour. Build upon previous pencil drawing skills to link to our seasons learning by drawing a flower which we will then create in the style of Yayoi Kusama. 	 <u>Understanding the World</u> Our main focus this half term will be all about the lifecycle of a hen and how to care for chicks. We will also be looking for signs of new growth to let us know that Spring is on its way. Understand key features of the lifecycle of a hen. Understand the need to respect and care for all living things Explore the natural world around them. Understand the effect of changing seasons.
