#### **Statement of Principle**

As a Catholic School, we strive to reflect the teachings of Christ and live out the Gospel Values in everything that we do. This means that our children are taught to; forgive, be tolerant of others, be truthful, be respectful to each other and all adults, live peaceful lives and to love each other.

We believe that staff, parents and children are entitled to a safe and protective environment in which to work, play, and just be.

Should anyone attempt to spoil our safe and peaceful environment in any way we will take the matter very seriously and do everything in our power to prevent this from happening.

#### **Our Expectations:**

- That all adults visiting our school set a good example to children at all times, showing them how to get along with all members of the school and the wider community.
- That no members of staff, parents, children or other visitors are the victims of abusive behaviour or open threats from other adults on the school premises.
- Physical attacks, threatening behaviour, intimidation, abusive or insulting language - verbal or written, to staff, governors, parents, carers, children and other users of the school premises, will not be tolerated.

#### **Actions by school:**

- A meeting with the Headteacher to discuss any incident, **may** take place.
- A warning letter, **may** be issued
- Any adult can be prevented from entering school grounds by a letter issued by the County solicitor.

The Headteacher's decision is final.

Appeals can be made to the Chair of Governors.
