Anti-Bullying Week & Our Catholic Values

We began November with Anti-Bullying Week, where the children made meaningful links between our mission, vision and values. With the support of our Primary Leadership Team, pupils explored the Beatitudes and reflected on how their teachings can guide our words and actions towards one another.



Each week this term has had a focus on a Beatitude, which the children have linked into their class assemblies for parents, helping us to consider how we can live these teachings in school to support kindness, respect and anti-bullying. The children also connected this learning to Red Wednesday, reflecting on how we can support persecuted Catholics around the world.

Over the past year, children from across the parish have been preparing for their Sacrament of Confirmation. We were honoured to welcome Bishop Paul to St Kentigern's for a touching and moving Confirmation Mass, celebrated alongside children and families from Christ the King and St Mary's parishes.
