Geog	<p>Human and physical geography and land use -</p> <p>Children will research the human and physical features of York to produce models of the topography of the land. They will look at how the physical geographical features have impacted on the development of human features eg tourism, transport, settlements, land use and how it has changed over time.</p>	<p>Map skills and fieldwork -</p> <p>Children will develop their understanding of using 8 cardinal points to give directions and instructions through orienteering activities, and use ordnance survey maps and 6 figure coordinates to find specific locations.</p>	<p>World Geography -</p> <p>Children will look at how many countries are in the world, using a wide range of maps, atlases and globes to identify them, naming some of the key countries in each continent and name and understand the significance of the BRIC countries. They will study and debate a current event in the news or a world-wide topical issue eg climate change/sustainable fuel, and what the major countries in the world are doing about it, including the UK. They will lead a whole school project on the chosen topic.</p>

<p>Sci</p>	<p>Animals including humans - Children will learn about the human circulatory system and the heart, the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the human body and the ways in which nutrients and water are transported in animals.</p> <p>Living things and their habitats - Children will focus on the classification of living things, including micro-organisms, plants and animals, giving reasons according to their characteristics.</p> <p>(Plant vegetables for Spring term)</p>	<p>Evolution and inheritance - Children will learn about how and why living things have changed over time and use fossils to gain information from millions of years ago. They will look at how living things produce offspring of the same kind but with variations and how plants and animals are adapted to suit their environment, with adaptation leading to evolution.</p>	<p>Light - Children will study how people see objects, including how light travels, reflection and shadows.</p> <p>Electricity - Children will investigate the impact of the number and voltage of cells on the power and volume of bulbs and buzzers, comparing and giving reasons for how components in a circuit function.
