What your child will need and homework

Your child will have daily reading practice, weekly spellings and a piece of Numeracy homework (sent home on a Friday) each week. Completed homework should be sent into school as soon as possible before Wednesday. This will enable us to mark it and put new homework in folders.

We understand that your children have other activities outside of school and may have difficulty completing tasks on a set night. If this is the case, please complete the homework when time is available.

PE and Forest Schools

P.E. takes place every Tuesday and is led by Mr Rose. On this day, children should come to school dressed in their P.E. kit, ready for active learning.

Forest School will be on Monday 6th October and Monday 8th December

Each class will take part in a Forest School session once per term. On these days, children will be learning outdoors and engaging in hands-on activities, which may involve mud and messy play. Please ensure your child comes dressed in appropriate clothing, including waterproofs and sturdy footwear. We recommend older clothes that you don't mind getting dirty.
