Dear Parents,

We hope that you all had a wonderful and relaxing summer with your families. We're so pleased to have welcomed the children back to school and can't wait to get to know them better in the coming weeks. Brown Class will be taught by Mrs Barker and Mrs Stoker, supported by Miss McKenzie and White Class will be taught by Mr Chadwick and supported by Mrs Reay.

Topics this term

English

This half term English will be based on Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl. After half term we will be linking our English work to our Romans topic and will be reading Roman Diary: The Journal of Iliona and a non-fiction text, Roman Soldiers.

Children in Year 4 will also be taking part in the online reading programme 'Reading Plus'. Reading Plus is an adaptive literacy solution that improves fluency, comprehension, vocabulary, stamina and motivation. It is personalised to each individual child according to their current reading ability.

A reading list compiled by our English Lead has also been attached to the newsletter for your child. The list is intended to provide guidance about age-appropriate books. It is also intended to help encourage your child to read a wider variety of genres and authors. We encourage the children to try reading some of the books from this list or to read them with someone at home. These books are all available to borrow from the school library.

Spellings

From next week, your child will bring home 8 spellings on a Thursday which we'd like them to learn for a test on the following Thursday. 6 of these words will be based on our weekly spelling rule, and the other 2 words will be high frequency words from Years 2, 3 and 4. These lists are attached to the newsletter.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths this term, we will be covering the following objectives from the Year 4 curriculum:

- Place Value, ordering and rounding of digits up to 10,000
- Counting in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 100.
- Adding and subtracting numbers up to 4 digits using formal written methods.

- Recalling multiplication and division facts up to 12×12 .
- Multiplying 2 and 3 digit numbers by a one-digit number.
- Measuring and calculating the perimeter of rectilinear shapes.

Your child should have a Times Tables Rock Stars login. We will often set the children challenges on TT Rockstars as part of their homework and it really is a fantastic resource to help children learn their times tables, so please do make use of it at home. At the end of the year, children sit the national 'Multiplication Tables Check' so there will be a focus on times tables throughout Year 4 to ensure that children know their times tables confidently and fluently before moving to the Upper Juniors.

<u>History</u> - A year-long focus on the Romans beginning with 'Why did the Romans march through Durham?'

<u>Geography</u> - Our unit this term will have us looking at Europe and using geographical skills to learn more about our continent.

<u>Science</u> - Our areas of study during the Autumn term this year in science will be 'Animals including Humans' and 'States of Matter'.

<u>Computing</u> - In our lessons we will be learning about computer networks and refamiliarising ourselves with the apps 'Pages' and 'Keynote'. E-safety will focus on keeping our personal information safe and protecting our online reputation.

<u>Art</u> - Keeping in step with our history topic, we will look at Roman mosaic patterns and prints.

 $\underline{\text{D\&T}}$ - The children will be designing and making a moving character which uses pneumatics to initiate the movement.

<u>PSHE/RSE</u> - This term our topic in PSHE is Health and Wellbeing. We will focus on using a greater vocabulary to describe our emotions and recognise emotions in others. We will look at ways to manage our mental health and ways to boost our resilience. We will finish off the term looking at recognising, predicting and assessing risks, particularly focusing on risks in our local environment and road safety. If you have any questions or concerns about any of these topics, please don't hesitate to contact us.

Timetable

Please find attached a copy of the Year 4 timetable. This is to give you an idea about what your child has learned each day but is subject to change (other than PE).

This year our PE day is a Friday. Please remember that your child should come to school already dressed for PE. Children will continue to access Forest Schools throughout the year, and we will let you know in advance so that appropriate clothing can be worn to school on those days.

Homework

In Year 4, children will receive a piece of maths homework on a Thursday, to be completed by the following Thursday when it will be marked. We ask that you also read with your child for 10 to 15 minutes each night. Fostering a life-long love of reading is our main focus and so we encourage you to also read **to** your child, discussing the book you are reading - this may include character intent [Why did he say that?] but also your own responses to the plot [I don't think I could have done that because...]

Whether they have read to you or you to them, please can you encourage your child to regularly update their reading record and then can you initial it each week as a check. Children should have their school reading book and reading record in their bag on a daily basis to enable us to listen to them read. Reading books can be changed on a morning.
