Homework	Maths activity given on a Thursday, to be completed by the following Thursday. In addition, there will also be: Maths - Practising times tables using Times Table Rock Stars English - Weekly spellings
Spelling	On a Thursday, your child will bring home spellings which we'd like them to learn for a test on the following Thursday.  Some of these words will be based on our weekly spelling rule, and the other words will be from the Year 2 or Year 3/4 list of key spellings which children should know by the end of Year 4. Both lists are attached to the newsletter.
Reading	We ask that you read regularly with your child at home, discussing the book you have read. As part of our comprehension this year, an ability to understand what is being read is important and the more work children can do on this the better.  <i>Please can you write a short comment in your child's reading record to show when you have read with them at home and encourage your child to record the books they have read too.</i>  Children should ensure they have their school reading book and reading record in their bag on a daily basis. They can also bring a book of their own choice and have access to books from the lower junior library. A reading list compiled by our English Lead has also been attached to the newsletter for your child. The list is intended to provide guidance about age-appropriate books. It is also intended to help encourage your child to read a wider variety of genres and authors. We encourage the children to try reading some of the books from this list or to read them with someone at home. These books are all available to borrow from the school library.
PE kit	PE day is a Friday. Please remember that your child should come to school already dressed for PE.  Our class will continue to access Forest Schools throughout the year, and we will let you know in advance so that appropriate clothing can be worn to school on those days.

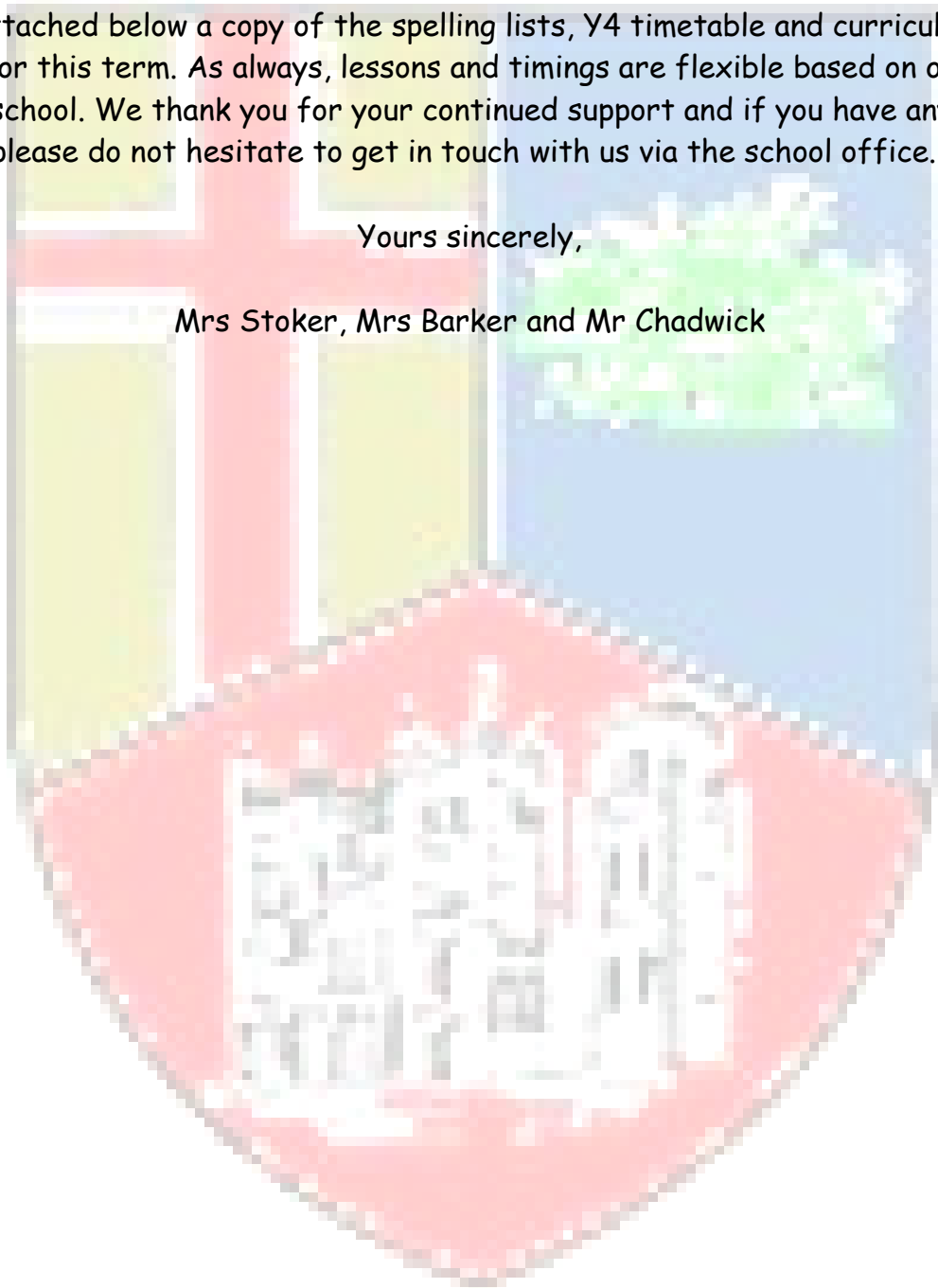

## Y4 Curriculum information - Spring Term

English	In English, we will be looking at different aspects of fiction and non-fiction writing and reading skills, including writing a narrative, a playscript and a persuasive leaflet. The class text is 'The Legend of Podkin One-Ear' by Kieran Larwood.
Maths	<p>In Maths this term, we will be covering the following objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mental and written multiplication</li> <li>• Mental and written division</li> <li>• Fractions: finding fractions of quantities, equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting fractions</li> <li>• Decimals: recognise decimal equivalents of <math>\frac{1}{4}</math>, <math>\frac{1}{2}</math> and <math>\frac{3}{4}</math>, rounding and ordering decimals, dividing decimal numbers by 10 and 100</li> <li>• Area of rectilinear shapes</li> </ul> <p>All Year 4 children (who are working at Year 2 level and above) will be taking part in the national Year 4 Multiplication check in June. Please ensure your child is practising their times tables regularly.
