	Please can you write a short comment in your child's reading record to show
	when you have read with them at home and encourage your child to record
	the books they have read too. Reading records should also be signed by a
	parent each week.

Maths	In Maths this term, we will be covering the following objectives: • Mental and written multiplication • Mental and written division • Fractions: finding fractions of quantities, equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting fractions • Decimals: recognise decimal equivalents of \$\frac{1}{4}\$, \$\frac{1}{2}\$ and \$\frac{3}{4}\$, rounding and ordering decimals, dividing decimal numbers by 10 and 100 • Area of rectilinear shapes All Year 4 children (who are working at Year 2 level and above) will be taking part in the national Year 4 Multiplication check. Please ensure your child is practising their times tables regularly.
