Synonyms: mean the same thing. You need to have a wide enough vocabulary to be able to recognise or think of alternatives to every day or common words. Reading widely can help you.

- Ensure you check that the synonym you use still makes sense in the sentence.
- In the example, 'The film was really **sad**,' synonyms for **sad** might include <u>tragic</u> or <u>upset</u>. Which of these would be the best choice?

Antonyms: means the opposite. Once again, make sure that the antonyms you choose still make sense in the context that they are being used.

Suffixes can help to make antonyms too:

tune → tuneful and tuneless

Proctor and Gamble are emitting a million micrograms of air pollution per cubic metre every month.

Compare this to the city of Bristol, where only 100 micrograms of air pollution have been measured.

Air pollution has many different effects, on both humans and nature. A study, carried out by Oxford University found that babies born in cities weighed at least 5 grams less than those born in less polluted areas.

In addition, air pollution can also affect our breathing, lungs and people's asthma. Can you imagine not being able to breathe whilst outside? That is the situation for 250, 000 asthmatics who live in our polluted towns and cities.

Also, air pollution can affect plants and animals. If plants take in polluted air, eventually they will die which will mean there is no food for animals and humans.

In the future, we all need to work together to reduce air pollution. You could use your car less, why not take a bike on short journeys?

Most importantly, join the campaign to force Proctor and Gamble to reduce their air polluting emissions.

Wednesday 20th January 2021 RE: Can I use the Bible to find quotes?

The Bible contains lots of different types of books such as...Historical books:

• these books give an account of special events in the life of the Jewish people. They are not history as we know today, but a record of God leading his people through episodes and characters e.g. 2 Samuel 2, David is made king of Judah.

Poems and hymns:

 These could be a prayer as a thanksgiving or in praise of God. They were used at daily services in the Temple and synagogue, and today by Jewish people and Christians in their worship e.g. Psalm 117 Praise the Lord all you nations.

Wise sayings

• these are short and easy-to-remember sayings, used by people in their everyday lives e.g. Proverbs 6: 6-11 Learn from the ant.

Good News:

- the Gospels. They are not a biography of Jesus, but record the memories about Jesus and of those whose lives were changed through contact with him e.g. Matthew
- 18: 1-5. Jesus welcomes children.

- If you have a Bible:
- Open your Bible at the half way point!

 It is likely to be around Sirach or Wisdom. It will certainly be in the Old Testament. Whilst keeping their Bibles open at the half way point, ask them to open the half to the left, that is the first quarter, which could be around Kings. Then do the same on the right hand half that could be Mark or John. Ask them to find the start of the Gospels and notice how much of the Bible is the New Testament.

Looking up Biblical text

- Like using a dictionary, it helps to know where to begin to look. When you want to read a particular text in the Bible, you would use a reference for example 1 Kings 10: 23-25.
- 1 Kings that is the first **book** of Kings
- 10 is the number of the **chapter** in that book
- 23-25 refers to the **verses** in that chapter. These are the small numbers used to divide up the chapter.
