




No more spots and squiggles!


No more stars and stripes!



A moustache on a mammoth!


This is lots of fun!

And says, "Look what he's done!"




And they rollick and they frolic, they trumpet and they crash,
They wade into the water. They roll and romp and splash.






They shake the baby by the hand, then lift their trunks and wave
