Religious Education

Show some understanding of the historical context of Abraham (and Joseph) and the cultural and religious context out of which he was called.

Retell the story of Abraham, ensuring it is accurate in sequence and detail and shows an understanding of the term 'covenant'.

Show an understanding of the story of Abraham and Isaac (Genesis 22:1-18), recognising the importance of historical context in explaining the meaning of this story then and now.
Show some understanding of how the decisions of Abraham (and Jenny) were informed by their faith, hope, and love in God.
Make links between prayers that show trust in God and the virtues of faith, hope, and love.

Science

Describe the simple functions of the basic parts of the digestive system in humans.
Identify the different types of teeth in humans and their simple functions.
Construct and interpret a variety of food chains, identifying producers, predators and prey.

History

Recall the Roman withdrawal from Britain Empire and the fall of the western Roman Empire.
Identify the Scots invasions from Ireland to North Britain (now Scotland).
Recognise Anglo Saxon settlements, including place names and village life.
Understand Anglo Saxon culture in relation to crime and punishment.
Discover when and how the Anglo Saxons migrated.

Art

Create a three-dimensional effect by using contrasting tones to show light and dark.
Combine lines and marks to represent different textures.
Use lines and marks in different ways to represent dark and light areas (tone).
Comparing the sizes of different objects to draw them in proportion.
Represent the size of one object relative to another.
Consider where to place each element thinking carefully about the space.
Show texture in the collage.
Use the impasto technique to create textured effects.

PSHE

Recap learning in PSHE from the previous year and how we can help everyone to learn effectively in our lessons.
Understand that manners vary in different situations.
Understand boundaries in friendships, including physical boundaries and expectations.
Understand that what they do and say affects other people.
Understand the impact of bullying and the role bystanders can take.

Music

Mamma Mia

This unit contains Listen & Appraise apps, Warm-up Games, Flexible Games, improvisation resources, and a new compose tool. As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose with the well-known song Mamma Mia, children will listen and appraise more ABBA hits.

PE

Dance Iron Man

Create a short dance sequence which reflects the dynamics and quality of their character.
Create a unison phrase as their transition between the dances which is performed identically by all dancers and to the same timing (8 counts).

Work together with a partner to create, rehearse and perform a duet sequence.

Invasion Games – Handball

Shoot a ball one handed with consistency and accuracy

Throw and catch a ball using a one-handed pass with consistency and accuracy.

Throw and catch a bounce pass with consistency and accuracy.

Use a simple tactic to outwit an opponent, i.e. pretend to throw one way then another.

Use simple tactics without the ball (i.e. moving into a space to receive a pass. Communicate showing where they want the ball).
