To let out a grunt because you've got taller.






Cryptic clue 3:

A very simple mode of air travel.






Cryptic clue 4:

A section of time without war.







Cryptic clue 5:

A nasty shower that drenches The Queen on her throne.






Can you use one of your homophone spelling words in a sentence that contains direct speech?




