# Warm up: You can either use a dice or a smart device to generate the numbers (or make it up)

- Complex sentence game -
  - 'Roll a dice and find the corresponding sentence structure. Tell me about how you are feeling at the moment. Write a sentence using that type of structure. Repeat until you have a paragraph.'
  - 1) A relative clause. E.g, I am feeling ok, not as happy as I could be, I have tried really hard.
  - 2) Subordinate clause at the end. E.g I am finding home learning tricky, I am sure that I am not alone.
  - 3) A short sentence E.g. BORED! Or Chilled.
  - 4) A long descriptive sentence e.g. lots of adverbs (describe your actions) and adjectives (describe yourself)
  - 5) A simple sentence. I am feeling ok because I am a home.
  - 6) A rhetorical question. Does Mr Johnson really believe....?


