What are adverbs?

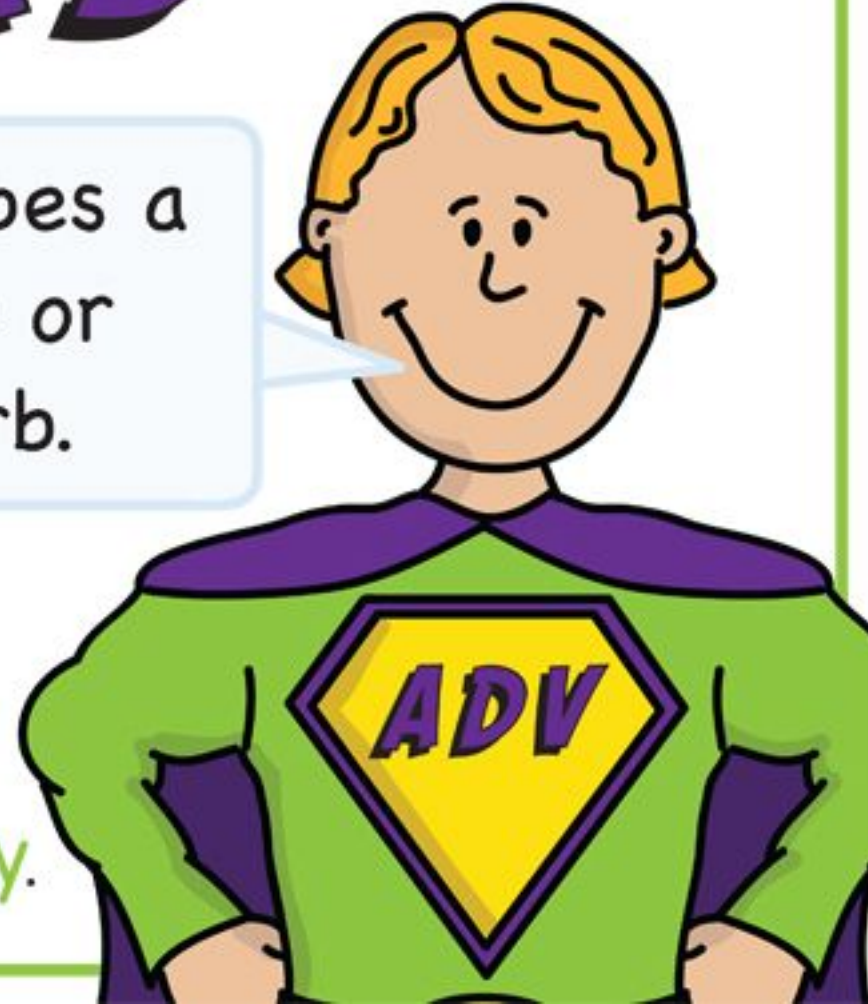

ADVERB

An **adverb** describes a verb, adjective or another adverb.

They talked **loudly**.

She danced **beautifully**.



Look at this sentence.
Can you spot the adverb?

The fluffy kitten purred loudly.

Adverb

The adverb describes **how** the kitten purred.
Adverbs often end in -ly.
