You need a new line for a new speaker

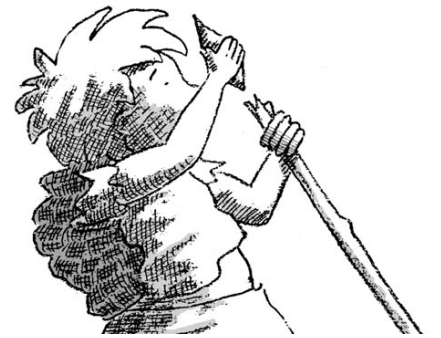

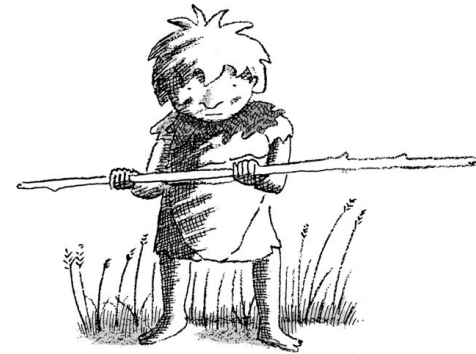
